MATCH REPORT

Goals either side of half-time from Luke Armstrong and George Thomson were good enough to secure a 2-0 win for Town against ten-man Morecambe. Armstrong fired home a penalty on 20 minutes before Thomson struck a sensational free-kick midway through the second-half after Ferrand Rawson had been sent off after receiving a second yellow card. The win saw Town bring a run of three successive defeats to an end.

The visitors created the first chance of note on ten minutes when the lively Tom Bloxham fed JJ McKiernan but the Shrimps striker slipped at an inopportune moment to end the early attack.

Despite ceding possession in the opening stages Town got the lead when an impressive move featuring George Thomson and Toby Sims saw the winger fire a shot on goal. The effort was blocked but Sam Folarin's rebound was blocked by the arm of Ferrand Rawson. Despite protests that saw Rawson and Jacob Bedeau yellow carded Armstrong stepped up to crash the spot kick home.

Sparked into life Town went close shortly after but Daly headed straight into the arms of Moore. Played in by an incisive Sutton pass, Matty Foulds then delivered a low testing cross that skidded across the face of goal to safety. A probing cross from Folarin was then met at the far post by Armstrong who made strong contact but couldn't direct his header on target. Armstrong then won possession and fired a shot just wide as the half drew to a close.

The second-half began with an immediate yellow card for Sutton who was late in his challenge on substitute Taylor.

Daly then powerfully met Falkingham's deep cross but he was under the ball and his effort landed some way over the bar.

Bloxham woke the travelling fans from their slumber on the hour mark with a volley that caused Oxley concern before flying wide. Mellon then turned quickly to fire beyond the stranded Oxley who was relieved to see the ball cannon back off the advertising hoardings. Derek Adams made a pair of changes but almost immediately though Rawson was shown a second yellow card for a foul on Sutton and once the dust had settled on the protests, Thomson coolly stepped up to perfectly execute the resulting freekick, leaving Moore with no chance as it flew into the top left-hand corner.

The numerical disadvantage meant the visitors were always chasing the game and Town should have wrapped the game up with a third goal when Thomson's slide rule pass was inch perfect but Armstrong fired over. Their lead remained intact though and the final whistle brought with it a welcome three points for Town.

peaking on the occasion: "I was a Brighton supporter growing up but when I signed for Palace, I didn't really follow them as much as I probably should have. I was still watching them but started watching Chelsea too so probably favored them more as I grew up.

"I was on trial at Brighton when I was about 10 or 11 and I didn't enjoy it to be honest. Prior to that trial I was enjoying playing football with my mates and part of me thought going into an academy was too serious, too soon.

"I was enjoying my football and I think that got the best out of me. You look at the highest level, all players are enjoying themselves now. There wasn't really that much competition, you go into the academy at that age and results don't really matter because you're not really playing for anything.

"However, when you're in the Sunday League at 7,8 or 9 you're playing for titles and trophies. I started playing football to win and at that age I didn't really feel like that was the best environment to do that.

Four years on, the Town winger elected to start his academy journey with bitter rivals Crystal Palace. In good form Daly believes the opportunity was too good to turn down.

"Before I signed for Palace I felt I was playing really well. When the opportunity arose I didn't really read too much into it. I just thought I would give it a go because the chance of full-time football might never come around again.

"I was 14 at the time and to go into a Premier League academy at that age was too good an opportunity to let pass.

"I think you notice the technically ability straight away. They have chosen to go into academy football much earlier than me but at the same time I knew I had an advantage when it came to that competitiveness.

"I have always played to win, that was a value which was instilled in me at a young age and that gave me an edge over the other academy boys. Naturally, you try to play to your strengths but I was always working to try and bridge the gap to them but I had confidence in my ability which helped."

Having featured alongside several Premier League stars, Daly believes this helped to develop a strong mentality as a young player "I played alongside the likes of Tyreek Mitchell, who was a very good player, I also played briefly with Aaron Wan-Bissaka but featuring alongside these guys showed where you can get to if you stick in and keep performing."

"It was a great experience when I was there. I trained alongside the firstteam quite a bit and got to pick small things up from the experienced pros. You saw what they ate, how they prepared and all the other things you do as top professional.

"James McCarthur was a fantastic help for me. He is one of the best professionals I have seen and I would say that he probably doesn't get the credit which he deserves. As a team mate and a member of staff he set the standard for everyone else in the building.

"With guys like that, you rarely see them have an off day but even if they did the work rate and effort which they put in was still at the top level. It just goes to show that while ability matters if there is no effort and drive you get nowhere."

"I think achievements like that give you that positive reinforcement that you need. At that age, you can always have those doubts on what you're doing. I had that a lot when I was in the UI8s, I wasn't playing but as a footballer you understand it isn't going to be all easy going.

"However, when times like that come it's all about not getting too high but not getting too low. Experiences like that have helped me to get to where I am today."

After a successful first-year of his scholarship, Daly was chosen to feature in several Premier League squads with Palace. Despite not making an appearance, our number 11 believes the opportunity gave him an added confidence.

"I think achievements like that give you that positive reinforcement that you need. At that age, you can always have those doubts on what you're doing. I had that a lot when I was in the UI8s, I wasn't playing but as a footballer you understand it isn't



going to be all easy going.

"However, when times like that come it's all about not getting too high but not getting too low. Experiences like that have helped me to get to where I am today."

The former Palace winger continued to shine with The Eagles and in 2018 he was named the club's Scholar of the Year.

Looking back, Daly believes this accolade helped strengthen his belief on his chosen path in football.

"When you're in an academy like that, I think you can be overwhelmed by the amount of quality which is around you. Of course, no player is the same and we all have different qualities but winning that award was massive for me to show I am on the right track.

"That was right at the beginning of my career but I think it helped me realise that if I keep putting in the hard work then I will get to where I want to be."

While enjoying a successful season at The Eagles, it would be the next campaign where Daly would begin to seek competitive football once again.

"The season after I went out on loan to Kingstonian. I spent three or four months there and absolutely loved it, that was my first experience of senior football and it was a great one. "I was sharing a dressing room with lads and getting back into the rhythm of playing for three points again. It was a great feeling to have that competition back in my life and in my career.

"While I was there, I still got the chance to use the facilities at Palace. I was working with some great coaches at the club, continuing my development. However, I also had the competition for places on a Saturday.

"That winning feeling is the best buzz you can have in football. It's performance based and winning is what football is all about. If you're picking up three points regularly, you know the players in the team are doing well."

"Going back I knew I needed to play senior football. I wasn't bother about the level at that point, I was more focused on getting out there. In an academy, I almost think it's too comfortable at times and especially with the coaches and facilities at our disposal.

In order to return to first-team action, the Town winger chose to leave Palace in order to join League One side Bristol Rovers.

While a difficult decision, Daly believes he made the right choice in joining Rovers.

"It was a difficult decision to leave. It wasn't until I was away from the club I realised how big the support network around the club was. From there, I knew it was up to me to work it out for myself."

"They had been watching me for a while. I knew there was interest for a while, initially it was going to be a loan but they wanted me permanently. I had a quick decision to make, I knew how much it meant to me so I thought I would give it a go."

"As soon as I went there it felt right for me. The level and standard of the dressing room I was in felt right. I settled quickly and felt at home, there was a lot of pressure at times but that was another key learning experience.

"I knew I had to work hard, I trusted my ability and the habits I had developed. I knew that if I stuck to them every week then I would continue to improve."

Daly also scored his first football league goal for The Pirates, this achievement is one which remains special to this day.

"The buzz was great, that personal accomplishment of scoring in a senior game was something I wanted to achieve so it was a proud moment. Looking back at the five or six years prior, you see that hard work being rewarded."

The former Palace and Rovers man would then move on to Stevenage. While suffering from injury, Daly believes this difficult period helped to improve him as a player.

"My time at Stevenage taught me so much about myself, I learned how to condition myself even better than before. I did get hit with a couple of injuries and it became a bit of a stopstart season.

"Obviously, that was a difficult period but it's another experience in the collective journey. I look at it and see that it's only benefitted me now. I feel like I am better for that spell now.

"After that, I felt I needed to play consistently, having come off the back of that season I trusted in my ability but knew I needed to nail down a place somewhere.

"For me, that's the only way you



improve as a player and that was the main focus for me. I spoke to the manager at Woking and the way wanted to play suited my style."

Reflecting on his season with the National League side, Town's number 11 believes his spell with Woking was some of the best football of his career.

"At times some players seek to avoid dropping out the football league as a bit of an ego thing. However, the standard is always improving and it's a very competitive league.

"It was a challenging year but I had a great year so I can only speak highly of that. That season has given me a platform and a chance to go again here with Harrogate."

"I think I've got a good understanding for what it takes to be successful. It's a long season playing in the football league, I've got an understanding now where I can look after my body so it's about producing consistent performances." Despite the offer to remain with Woking, Daly opted to join Town in the summer transfer window.

When discussing the decision, Daly cited the club's style of play as a key reason for his return to the football league

"I had the offer to stay but when an opportunity like this comes up I couldn't really turn down the move. I spoke to the gaffer and I viewed this as another opportunity I wanted to grab with both hands.

"The coaches have all been clear. They want me to continue to be myself, playing my game and I think my qualities suit the style of play we have here. I have to focus on that and keep trying to contribute.

"I feel like I am in the right place to use my skills. It's a massive importance to be in the right environment and having been here for a couple of weeks I believe this club is right for me."

Prior to the 2003/04 season, Town fans were informed that Mark Atkins was moving to Wetherby Road as player/coach under then manager, John Reed.



Prior to that. Atkins was an integral part of Blackburn's rise from the old Second Division to Premier League champions in 1995 having joined Rovers from Scuthorpe United in 1988. In his time at Ewood Park he amassed 257 appearances, scoring 34 before he moved on to Wolves in 1995. He also played for York City, Doncaster Rovers, Hull City and Shrewsbury Town before moving to Harrogate. He made a total of 53 appearances in his time at Wetherby Road before both he and manager John Reed left for Stalybridge Celtic in January 2005.

THE LOWDOWN

After finishing just outside the Championship play-off positions in seventh last season, there has been plenty of change at Ewood Park over the Summer, with multiple key players departing the club, though there are still plenty of reasons for optimism of Rovers finishing in the top six this time round.

Rovers have recruited shrewdly to replace the likes of Bradley Dack who signed for Sunderland and Ben Brereton Diaz who joined Villarrael on a free transfer, adding Sondre Tronstad, Niall Ennis and Arnor Sigurðsson to their squad, and there will likely be more moves made before the transfer window closes.

Manager, Jon Dahl Tomasson, operated with a pretty young starting 11 for the majority of last season and his desire to play quick, attacking football means his squad has a youthful look again for the upcoming campaign. He has a solid squad to work with which includes some extremely talented youngsters.

Jon, 46, arrived at Rovers in June last year having led Swedish side Malmo FF to backto-back league titles.

In an illustrious playing career, the former Denmark international represented Heerenveen, Newcastle United, Feyenoord, AC Milan, VfB Stuttgart and Villarreal, and scored a record 52 goals in 112 caps for his country.

After moving into coaching upon retiring in 2011, he had brief spells as head coach of Dutch clubs Excelsior and Roda JC, before taking up assistant manager roles with Vitesse Arnhem and the Denmark national team. Jon was appointed manager of Malmo FF in January 2020 and during a twoyear period in charge, he led the Swedish club to successive Allsvenskan league titles, as well as to the group stages of the UEFA Champions League.



MEET THE SQUAD

GOALKEEPERS

Signing from Middlesbrough in October 2020, **Aynsley Pears** progressed through Boro's youth ranks, and received England recognition at UI9 level, before having loan spells with Darlington and Gateshead. He made his Boro debut in August 2019 and went on to play 24 games in the Championship before moving to Ewood Park. He had to wait until February 2023 to have a run in the side and ended 2022/23 as first choice.

Sweden international **Leopold Wahlstedt** signed early this month from Norwegian outfit, Odds BK. The 24-year-old started his career in his native Sweden at Dalkurd Fr in August 2018, aged just 19. A move to Norwegian outfit Arendal followed, before he signed for top-flight club Odds BK ahead of the 2021 campaign where he went on to make 64 appearances. Wahlstedt received his first call-up to the Sweden squad in September 2022.

Joe Hilton arrived at Rovers in 2019 after leaving Everton. He had a short loan spell at Fleetwood Town, where he made his senior debut, before going on to spend the remainder of the 2020/21 season with Ross County.Hilton played 16 times for Hamilton during a season-long stay in 2021/22, but spent most of last season as Rovers' third choice. The 23-year-old played the full game in the 4-3 win over Walsall in the last round.

DEFENDERS

Full-back **Callum Brittain**, signed in June 2022. Having started his career at MK Dons, Brittain made over 100 league appearances for the Dons, helping them win promotion to League One in 2018/19, before joining Barnsley in October 2020. Brittain played 74 league games for the Tykes in two seasons before joining Rovers. After a knee injury, the 25-year-old returned in February 2023 and ended the campoian with 29 total appearances.

Rovers signed **Harry Pickering** from Crewe Alexandra in January 2021 where the 24-year-old had been since a young age, before making his first-team debut in April 2017, aged 18. After establishing himself as first-choice full-back in 2018/19, Pickering played nearly 150 times for the Railwaymen and is now fast approaching 100 appearances in Rovers colours. Scotland international, **Dom Hyam** moved to Rovers in August 2022 from Coventry City. Having started his career at Reading, he had loan spells with Dagenham & Redbridge, Portsmouth and Aldershot Town before joining Coventry in 2017, helping the Sky Blues win the League One title in 2019/20. Hyam racked up 192 appearances in total for Coventry. The 27-year-old's debut campaign at Ewood Park memorable with the defender playing 42 times, scooping the Player and Players' Player of the Year as well as making his full Scotland debut in June.

Central defender **Scott Wharton** has been at Rovers since an early age, progressing through the ranks to now be a part of the senior squad. Making his debut in August 2016, he gained further experience on loan at Cambridge United, Lincoln City, Bury and Northampton Town. Back with Rovers in 2020, injury kept him out for much of 2020/21, however, upon his return, Scott nailed down a spot in the Rovers first-team.

Towering defender, **Hayden Carter** is approaching a decade at the club having joined Rovers at Ul4s level. In January 2021, Carter joined Burton Albion on Ioan and ended the campaign with 24 appearances. The 25-year-old then joined League One Portsmouth on Ioan in January 2022, playing 22 times. Last season proved to be a breakthrough campaign for him, as he forged a fine partnership with Dom Hyam, finisheding with 38 appearances in all competitions.

Local lad Sam Barnes is another Academy product having been with Rovers since the age of 11. Sam progressed through to the UI8s before gaining first-team experience on loan at Marine in early 2019. Upon returning to Rovers, Barnes moved up to the U23s before Jon Dahl Tomasson's handed Sam a squad number ahead of the 2022/23 campaign, but a knee injury saw him ruled out for the whole season. Jake Garrett is approaching a decade with the club having previously been on the books at both Everton and Liverpool. The defender, who has represented England at U15s and U16s level, signed his first pro contract in March 2020.

MIDFIELDERS

Attacking midfielder **Sammie Szmodics** joined Rovers last summer. He started his career with Colchester United, scoring 38 goals in 162 appearances for the U's. In June 2019, he signed for Bristol City but after finding opportunities limited, made



a January loan move to Peterborough, before joining permanently in September 2020. He enjoyed an impressive maiden season there, netting 15 league goals in 40 starts, helping Posh secure promotion to the Championship.

Norway international **Sondre Tronstad** signed for Rovers over the summer. The 27-year-old midfielder, a free transfer from Dutch Eredivisie side Vitesse Arnhem, begun his football journey with IK Start in his home country, making his debut in May 2012, aged 16. He joined Huddersfield Town in early 2014, before heading back home to join FK Haugesund where he chalked up over 100 appearances. He moved to Vitesse in January 2020 and earned his first Norway cap later that same year.

Attacking midfielder **Tyrhys Dolan** joined Rovers in the summer of 2021 from Preston North End. Having spent much of his youth career at Manchester City, Dolan joined Preston in July 2017. The teenager's encouraging performances in 2020/21 turned the youngster into a real favourite with the fans and that's continued to be the case ever since.

A product of the Blackburn academy, Joe Rankin-Costello made his senior debut in 2017 and is a very versatile player capable of playing in defence and midfield. Multiple injuries have hampered the 23-year-old's development until last season where he made the right-back spot his own in the second half of the season, playing 24 league matches with two goals and three assists.

Captain, Lewis Travis joined from Liverpool in December 2014. After being in and around the Rovers first team squads, his breakthrough came over the festive period in 2018, and since then, he has become a firm fixture at Rovers. 2019/20 was his first full campaign in professional football where he appeared



44 times in all competitions. Consistent performances saw Travis rewarded with the captain's armband by Tomasson. Attracting much interest from Premier League clubs **Adam Wharton** starred for Rovers multiple times last season, showing maturity beyond his years at the age of 19 in the middle of the park. The teenager played 18 times for in the Championship last season and by the end of it was a regular fixture in Tomasson's starting 11 and will no doubt continue to be this season as well.

Welsh international **Ryan Hedges** signed for Rovers in January 2022 from Aberdeen. Coming through the youth ranks at Everton, he signed his first pro contract with Swansea City. Whilst there, he had loan spells with Leyton Orient, Stevenage and Yeovil Town, before joining Barnsley in January 2017. His performances for the Tykes saw him callup by Wales in November 2017. During his time at Oakwell, he played 59 games and helped Barnsley earn promotion to the Championship in 2018/19 before joining Aberdeen at the end of that season.

Now a firm part of the first team furniture, John Buckley joined the club as a sixyear-old, and rose through Rovers' youth ranks before making his first team debut at the end of the 2018/19 campaign.

Midfielder **Andrew Moran** joined Rovers on a season-long loan from Brighton & Hove Albion last week. A Republic of Ireland U2I international, Moran joined Brighton in 2020 from Bray Wanderers, where he was playing first team football by the age of 15. Moran enjoyed a standout season in 2022-23, scoring 13 goals and claiming six assists in 23 appearances for Brighton's Under-21s, whilst also making his Premier League debut against Everton in January.

FORWARDS

Icelandic international **Arnor Sigurdsson** joined over the summer with Rovers taking advantage of FIFA's ruling regarding the suspension of contracts for players at Russian clubs to take the 24-year-old from CSKA Moscow for the 2023/24 season. Having scored 15 times in 26 appearances in the past year for Norrkoping - a top flight Swedish club, Sigurðsson has been capped 27 times for Iceland and it's hoped he could be Brereton Diaz's like-for-like replacement.

Sam Gallagher returned to Rovers from Premier League side Southampton in July 2019 having had a successful loan spell at Ewood Park during 2016-17. Initially on the books of Plymouth Argyle, Southampton signed him, and he made his Saints debut in November 2013, aged 18. Under Mauricio Pochettino, Gallagher enjoyed a brilliant breakthrough season at St Mary's in 2013/14, making 18 Premier League appearances. Following his loan at Rovers, Gallagher spent 2017/18 with Birmingham City. His first campaign back at Ewood Park ended with six goals in all competitions, and he bagged seven in 39 appearances last season.

Niall Ennis signed for Rovers in May from Plymouth Argyle. Starting his career at Wolves, featuring once in an FA Cup triumph over Shrewsbury Town, where he also spent time on loan during the 2017/18 season, further loan spells with Doncaster Rovers and Burton Albion followed, before the pacey attacker joined Plymouth Argyle in January 2021. Last term, Ennis scored 14 goals as the Pligrims secured the League One title.

Dilan Markanday signed for Rovers from Tottenham Hotspur in January 2022 having joined Spurs at the age of 11 and risen through the club's youth ranks. Stepping up to Spurs' U23s side in 2019/20, the winger netted 12 goals in 14 Premier League 2 fixtures. An injury on his Rovers debut at Hull City unfortunately ruled him out for much of 2021/22. In January 2023, he joined Aberdeen on Ioan until the end of the season. This term, he scored his first goal in English League football and also Blackbum's first goal of the season against West Brom.

Young attacker, **Zak Gilsenan** penned a new two-year deal with Rovers in June can play anywhere across the forward line and has been with the club since Ulôs level, having previously been on the books of Barcelona and Liverpool in his youth. Gilsenan, who is eligible to play for both Australia and the Republic of Ireland was a regular for Rovers U2Is last season.

Young striker, **Harry Leonard** has been with Rovers since linking up with the Academy at UI0s level. Progressing through the ranks, the teenage frontman is now part of the first-team squad after an impressive 2022/23 campaign, topscoring for the U2Is with 20 goals in all competitions and making his first of four senior outings in April.


