SIMON WEAVER

It's great to be back at The EnviroVent for league action after such an impressive performance against Morecambe. In that match, I thought we showed a fantastic level of urgency in our play and earned the right to play.

After our defeat against Accrington, it really felt like the rest button had been hit. We took some time to reflect on where we are and the type of team we want to be.

Obviously, there is no getting away from the fact we let ourselves down there against Accrington but I thought the players went a long way to putting that performance right.

From that very first whistle you could see we came out swinging and as a support we sensed the fans were lifted by that.



MATCH REPORT

Goals either side of half-time from Luke Armstrong and George Thomson were good enough to secure a 2-0 win for Town against ten-man Morecambe. Armstrong fired home a penalty on 20 minutes before Thomson struck a sensational free-kick midway through the second-half after Ferrand Rawson had been sent off after receiving a second yellow card. The win saw Town bring a run of three successive defeats to an end.

The visitors created the first chance of note on ten minutes when the lively Tom Bloxham fed JJ McKiernan but the Shrimps striker slipped at an inopportune moment to end the early attack.

Despite ceding possession in the opening stages
Town got the lead when an impressive move
featuring George Thomson and Toby Sims saw the
winger fire a shot on goal. The effort was blocked
but Sam Folarin's rebound was blocked by the
arm of Ferrand Rawson. Despite protests that saw
Rawson and Jacob Bedeau yellow carded Armstrong
stepped up to crash the spot kick home.

Sparked into life Town went close shortly after but Daly headed straight into the arms of Moore. Played in by an incisive Sutton pass, Matty Foulds then delivered a low testing cross that skidded across the face of goal to safety. A probing cross from Folarin was then met at the far post by Armstrong who made strong contact but couldn't direct his header on target. Armstrong then won possession and fired a shot just wide as the half drew to a close.

The second-half began with an immediate yellow card for Sutton who was late in his challenge on substitute Taylor.

Daly then powerfully met Falkingham's deep cross but he was under the ball and his effort landed some way over the bar.

Bloxham woke the travelling fans from their slumber on the hour mark with a volley that caused Oxley concern before flying wide. Mellon then turned quickly to fire beyond the stranded Oxley who was relieved to see the ball cannon back off the advertising hoardings. Derek Adams made a pair of changes but almost immediately though Rawson was shown a second yellow card for a foul on Sutton and once the dust had settled on the protests, Thomson coolly stepped up to perfectly execute the resulting freekick, leaving Moore with no chance as it flew into the top left-hand corner.

The numerical disadvantage meant the visitors were always chasing the game and Town should have wrapped the game up with a third goal when Thomson's slide rule pass was inch perfect but Armstrong fired over. Their lead remained intact though and the final whistle brought with it a welcome three points for Town.



INTERVIEW BY NICKOLAS MCINALLY



Despite conceding his desire to cross the white line, the former Town defender admits it was the right time to hang up his boots.

"I had a great relationship with the gaffer and Thirs. We had spoken on a couple of occasions about the future, about where I saw myself and about where I wanted to be. I always made an effort to help lads after training which I think the gaffer noticed.

"He mentioned about a potential opportunity which could come up. He asked if it was something I would consider. It's a bia decision because it meant I had to be happy with the choice to stop playing.

"I spoke to a couple of ex-players and team mates. I had a couple of offers about playing part-time still but I wasn't sure that it was for me. I had made the decision to retire and I was happy to finish playing.

"I think I am quite particular with stuff too I'm not sure I would have been able to handle the part-time stuff. I was used to things being done right with no complacency and I wasn't sure if that would creep in.

"I spoke to an ex-manager who advised me to stay in the game where I can. They knew all about this club and when I told them I had the opportunity here they backed up my belief in this role being the right one for me."

At 36, McArdle now got set to begin the new stage of his life and that began with the desire to make a positive first impression on the new scholars.

"As a player, you don't really think about the planning which is done for you in the close season. Now I was starting to look at playing a role in that now. Obviously, I knew some of the second year scholars, they had come up to training a couple of times but I was new to the first years.

"I wanted to make sure I got the little things right. I didn't want to not know the players by name on that first day, if I was ever being coached by someone who didn't know my name



then it didn't quite sit right and hat was something that I wanted to avoid.

"I also had to introduce myself, I thought about that quite a lot over the summer. I spoke to them about passing on my experiences on, my new role and getting to know each other.

"It was the first meeting for us but I wanted to make sure the lads knew they could come and speak to me about anything."

Six weeks on from starting in his new role, McArdle is enjoying the opportunity to start fresh.

"It feels weird to be honest, during the summer I had time to reflect and relax but I was looking forward to what was next for me. We have been back around five / six weeks now and it has been great.

"This is something I have always been excited about doing. I am still involved in football but over on the other side now. I have learned a lot since I first started. I was always open to learning because I knew it wasn't going to be easy.

"For me, this was like starting again. I have been lucky with the staff that are here, they have all helped me settle in which has been great."

Looking back, McArdle remembers the delight from his family that he would continue his affiliation with Town

"My family were delighted, when I made the decision to retire I think they were cautious about what I would do next. I had lost my routine by retiring but coming back to the club, it gave me that back and they all know how I loved my time here.

"The club doesn't want to just stand still, we want to keep moving forward. They recognised it's not just a job, it's something for me to keep motivated with. I also had the opportunity to pass on my experience to the next generation."

After former Academy Manager Paul Stansfield departed the club last month. Town's new Development Phase Coach believes the transition with Stansfield was managed well.

"We all know how far this academy has come over the last two years. Paul was a mainstay of that and I have to give massive thanks to him. He was in every day helping Josh and I to build up a routine.

"If we needed anything at all he was there. That was a huge help and I don't think I would be as comfortable as I am now if I didn't have the feedback from having Stanners there. "His attention to detail and the way he works away from the pitch isn't something I was used to. We had a couple of presentations and you could see how he got his point across. He understood the boys and the way to speak to them. I'm glad I had the opportunity to sit and learn from him."

The new look coaching set up also sees Josh Law promoted to the role of Academy Manager and this coaching duo is one which McArdle is pleased to be part of.

"Alongside Paul, Josh Law has played a huge role over the last 18 months. Before taking the role, I already knew Josh because I had played with his brother Nicky before. That connection and relationship was important because before getting started I knew him well.

"We travel in together every morning. That gives us an hour meeting almost before we even get to training. The amount of stuff I have learned from those conversations have been great. He is another person who I can't thank enough.

"When we first started speaking about the way we would play and our approaches are very similar. Everyone wants to play well, keep the ball and create lovely passing moves. However, it isn't always possible but we are always open to playing the game which is in front of us."

When asked about the key principles of a side coached by Rory McArdle, the former Scunthorpe and Exeter man's answer was simple.

"I have tried to implement the discipline side of things. I want to see things done properly, as a group we won't cut corners, we will work hard, run around and make sure we have those fundamentals to build on.

"At 16, 17 years old then it gives our players a solid base. Obviously, we have Will too who is our Sports Scientist and he makes sure the lads are eating and fuelling themselves well. We have posters etc around where we train but we also want the lads to take a bit of ownership to look after themselves."



Having lost several members of the club's title winning side last season, McArdle praised the club's summer recruitment as we began the defence of our title three weeks ago.

"The crop of players coming through is different but there is a good core group of players still here. The recruitment which has been done is really good. I spoke to Josh and he shared his belief in the importance of this recruitment work and the building blocks that gives you for success.

"It's a challenge in itself but it's one which I want. The hard work the academy staff has done is shown in the quality of player which we produced over the last year. However, the challenge is there to replace them.

"It's always going to be difficult because a lot of people will want to go to the very best clubs. However, looking at the bigger picture we provide a better opportunity to play for the first-team and I think that is something we need to use to our advantage."

Looking ahead to the new season, Town's Development Phase Coach insists the club will not rest on their laurels.

"We aren't going to stand still, we want to keep getting better, we want to keep pushing as many into the first-team. That would keep improving on that success but we have to keep learning from every situation to piece it all together."

TOWN'S CLUB HISTORIAN PHIL HARRISON LOOKS BACK AT SOME BIG GAMES OVER THE YEARS BETWEEN THE TWO CLUBS...





n 2000/01, Town were in Northern Premier League (Unibond) Division One whilst Barrow were one higher in the Premier Division.

For the league cup competition it all began as the Unibond League Challenge Cup with Town in Group three. There were three cups on offer - the League, Presidents and Chairman's. Town were placed in the Chairman's Cup after drawing three and winning one in their group.

In the Quarter Final Town beat Runcorn 1-0 at home, a fifth clean sheet in succession, and met Worksop Town in the Semi-Final at home. 623 gathered at Wetherby Road with former Newcastle, Spurs and England International Chris Waddle 40, playing for the visitors. Not only did Town win the match 1-0 but also played without a recognised keeper for over half the game when Chris Hill was stretchered off with a

suspected broken leg. Outfield player, Kevin Severn went in goal and defied everything thrown at him and in so doing Town reached a Final for the first time in eleven years since 1990.

After winning the right of venue with the toss of a coin Town met Barrow in a plum tie at Wetherby Road on Thursday 19 April 2001 in front of 903. It was 1-1 after 90 minutes thanks to a late equaliser from Craia Elliott but with no further score in extra time, penalties would decide the winner. Barrow won the shoot-out 3-0.

Under Mick Hennigan and coach John Reed Town finished 11th in NPL Division One that season with Elliott finishing top scorer with 17 league and cup goals from 32 games while Barrow under Kenny Lowe finished 6th in NPL Premier Division with Nicky Peverell top scoring with 33 goals.

Town U18s maintained their unbeaten start to their Youth Alliance North East title defence with a hard-fought 2-2 draw with Hartlepool United on Saturday.

Town started brightly and with just three minutes on the clock could have taken an early lead when Elijah Samuels knocked down a ball forward into the path of Josh Brodella who drove past three Hartlepool defenders only for the keeper to turn away his low effort. On 16 minutes some fast link up play between Jack

Brav. Samuels and Brodella released Alfie Lee who drove towards the edge of the box and unleashed a powerful drive that hit the inside of the post and away to safety.

Hartlepool looked bright and energetic in possession, but it was Town who counter-attacked well on 21 minutes after Lee had won possession midway inside his own half. He passed forward to Bray who found Brodella in space who then drove forward again, before returning it to Bray who had continued his run

into the box who played it across goal for Samuels but his low effort was superbly saved by Pools keeper before being scrambled clear again.

Despite numerous opportunities for Town it was Pools that went ahead on 31 minutes when neat interplay between the Hartlepool forwards released the number 11 who fired home past Frankie Shepherd.

It did not take Town long to respond, however, as some clever play down the left released James Moorby who



was brought down for a free kick on the byline just outside the box. From the free kick, Ollie Nicholson delivered a pinpoint cross to Smalley at the back post who headed home and make it all square at half time.

30 seconds after the restart Town found themselves behind again from a dangerous cross into the middle of the box which was met by the Pools winger to steer the ball into the far corner.

Two minutes later Town thought they were level -Lee pressed high and won the ball, before releasing Samuels who drove at the defender and played a one-two with Lee before squaring the ball to Brodella to tap home, only for the assistant referee to flag for offside.

As Town went in search of the equaliser, the game became stretched with Hartlepool playing on the counter attack

Town continued to create chances and in the 65th minute, another good move between Lee, Samuels and Brodella opened the goal up for Brodella but he shot straight at the keeper. A minute later, and once again, Lee found Brodella to release a 3v2 situation, a lovely reverse ball from Brodella found the overlapping Lucas Barnes whose square ball for the waiting Obarotimi and Samuels, was gratefully smothered by the Pools keeper. On 72 minutes Samuels picked the ball up and drove towards the left hand side of the box and hit the ball across goal with his left foot which again just rolled past the far post.

The game continued to flow from end to end with both sides lacking the final pass to punish, but on 87 minutes Town finally got a deserved equaliser. EMILE ACQUAH


