

MATCH REPORT

A late stoppage time header from Jamie Walker denied Town all three points last Saturday at the University of Bradford Stadium.

Matty Daly's delightful dink on 78 minutes looked to be the difference between the two sides before Jamie Walker's header in the fifth minute of added time meant a share of the spoils.

Simon Weaver opted for an unchanged side from the previous week's 1-0 defeat to Gillingham. As for Bradford City, they were without their top goalscorer of last season Andy Cook.

Town had the first key chance of the game as Odoh was brought down on the edge of the box following a cheap giveaway from the Bradford defence. George Thomson stepped over the free kick from 20 yards out but unfortunately hit the Bradford wall and Harry Lewis in the Bradford goal was left untroubled.

Chances were few and far between in the opening half, however on 20 minutes, Daly broke through the middle of the park and released Armstrong on his way and bearing down on goal, but Town's top goal scorer of last season got the ball stuck under his feet and failed to get his shot off.

Former Town loanee Lewis Richards had a half chance on 36 minutes when the ball dropped to him perfectly on the edge of the box but his shot was seen sailing over the bar into the top stand.

The game livened up in the final 15 minutes of the half with both teams pushing to open the scoring. Jamie Walker was the standout man for the home side causing Town's defence to monitor him closely.

He had success down the right flank and tested the hands of Oxley for the first time on 42 minutes with a powerful strike, but it wasn't enough to break the deadlock going into half-time.

Jamie Walker continued to shine for Bradford early in the second half as his acrobatic effort from the penalty spot following a chipped cross from Chisom Afoka just couldn't find the target as the shot drifted just wide of the post. On 58 minutes, Afoka jinking run in from the left wing saw the forward unleash a low curling effort which Oxley parried away to safety.

On 67 minutes, Levi Sutton was bought on to replace George Thomson and Jeremy Sivi replaced Sam Folarin doon after. Sivi made an instant impact and was the attacking spark Town needed as Daly opened the scoring on 78 minutes. The Boro loanee showed positive play by taking his defender on IvI before releasing a cross which was deflected and fell into the path of Daly who produced a wonderful finish to put Town one up.

The final 10 minutes saw Bradford up the tempo in search of an equaliser. A late ball into the penalty area caused a defensive mix-up which Walker took advantage of to head home to grab a draw and a share of the points for the Bantams.

HOW A LAD FROM KENT BECAME A TOWN FA

There are 282 miles from Deal in Kent to Harrogate, and no bus.

Harry, 13, has been a keen player and follower of football for many years, so when he got a PlayStation the obvious game choice was FIFA. Having achieved success with top-flight teams he felt he needed a new challenge: What could he achieve with the newly promoted team in the lowest league? Harrogate Town was selected.

Over the course of four FIFA seasons and several months, they had won all leagues including the premiership, and all cup competitions, including the Champions League.

During this time Harry got to know the team well and started to follow their progress in real life and advised his Dad he was now a Harrogate Town supporter and asked if could he attend a match or two. He is now like any other

avid football supporter, knowing all player's names, stats, and the history of the club, and sporting club shirts tracksuits etc. He has now attended several away matches and recently made his first visit to The EnviroVent stadium to take in the atmosphere of a home game.

In his first-ever game away at Sutton United, he managed to have a selfie taken with his favorite player Jack Muldoon. Such is his tenacity to get to meet players and Manager Simon Weaver, which is what brought him to the attention of the Manager and club at this season's clash with Tranmere Rovers


The club has made excellent progress in reaching League Two under the tenure of Simon Weaver and Harry hopes that they can continue to progress, just like his FIFA Town team did!













'YOU'RE NOT GOOD ENOUGH.' IT CAN BE A BITTER BLOW FOR ANY YOUNG PROFESSIONAL LOOKING TO MAKE THEIR WAY IN FOOTBALL. HOWEVER. FOR DEAN CORNELIUS THOSE WORDS SET HIM ON A PATH TO KICK START HIS CARFER.

The Scottish midfielder, who spent six vears in the Hibernian academy. went on to join his boyhood club Motherwell following his release from the Edinburgh club.

Speaking on this setback, Cornelius said: "It came to the end of the season and I was called into a meeting with my parents to discuss the future. The club sat me down and told me there wouldn't be a contract for me which is completely fine because football is a game of opinions.

"I remember thinking and trying to plan how I dealt with that set back. At the time I was hurting and in their words I wasn't good enough so obviously it has an impact on you when you are that age.

"However, no one is going to have a perfect career, even the best players have suffered set-backs and when you face those mental barriers I think you come out the other side a better player but also a better person.

"I got released at the beginning of the summer and by the start of preseason I was signing for Motherwell. Luckily enough, a couple of the coaches had seen me play and they were just as keen as I was to get me in so it moved pretty quickly.

"It was a huge decision, I had the option to go on a couple of trials down south but I had seen the likes of David

Turnbull and Allan Campbell progress through the Motherwell academy so there was a pathway for me to follow."

The 22-year-old, who is in fact a Motherwell fan, was now representing the club he supported and Cornelius believes this added to his motivation. to kick on with the club.

"I was delighted when that happened." it was the club I had grown up supporting. My family were full of Motherwell fans and it was a dream to play for the club.

"Looking back, I think representing Motherwell made me that little bit hungrier to break into the first-team and do well. I was keen to make a mark in football but my whole family were Motherwell fans and my dad followed them home and away so I wanted to make them proud."

Reflecting on his career so far, Town's number eight believes he owes a debt of gratitude to his parents who gave him a platform to achieve his aim of becoming a professional footballer.

"I owe everything to my parents. They were so dedicated to my football, three nights a week they took on the commitment to take me to training which was an hour away from where we lived, on a good day. Every weekend they travelled up and down the country to watch me play.

"I owe everything to them and when I left Hibs and joined Motherwell, I think they were a bit relieved to be honest because the club was right on our door step."

While disappointed to leave Hibs. Cornelius paid tribute to the club's coaching staff who helped him to become a more rounded player.

"There was loads of coaches that I owe huge gratitude to for their role in my development. From my time at Hibs Lee Makel is one who stands out. We worked together a lot one-to-one and I definitely feel that working with him helped me to leave Hibs as a better player.

"I was always focused on giving my all when I was there. At the time there was a pathway into the first-team and I thought trying to follow that was the best thing for me but it just wasn't to be. I was always trying to make myself a better player than I was the day before. That is a mentality which I still keep today and I think it gives you a great chance at improving as a young footballer."

In joining Motherwell, Cornelius was given the opportunity to play under former Oldham and Morecambe manager Stephen Robinson and Motherwell legend Keith Lasley. Speaking on his time under the coaching duo, the midfielder believes they helped him to improve as a player.

"Stephen Robinson was manager when I signed and the results were flying in. He gave me my debut in the first-team but I never really got the chance to play regularly under him. However, I felt like I had really developed by working with him and his coaching staff in training.

"It was also great to work closely with someone like Keith Lasley. Growing up a Motherwell fan, I had watched him play for the club and he played in my exact position.

"We worked closely and he was constantly trying to help me to



improve. I was always trying to pick his brain to and I think that also helped me to improve."

Having been released by Hibs, Cornelius admits the opportunity to go up against his former club gave the game an added edge.

"It has actually worked both ways to be honest. When I was playing for Hibs at youth level, I was felt like I had a point to prove against Motherwell because those boys were playing for the club I supported. However, when I joined Motherwell and started playing in the first-team, it completely flipped and I had an edge when we played Hibs because it felt like I had a point

While representing your local club has it's benefits, the 22-year-old admits that this can be a double edged sword after his side suffered a bad run of results

"That is where it can become difficult. Naturally, if results aren't going your way then you start to check social media and because you support the club you hurt more. You always understand where fans are coming from but we always stayed positive, stuck together and trusted the process. It was completely different for me. I try to take it all in my stride because the last couple of years have taught me that you can't get too high or too low in football. Your emotions are all over the place depending on results and now its about trying to stay level headed."

Following a change of manager, current MK Dons boss, Graham Alexander took the reigns at Fir Park and Town's number eight believes his appointment marked the next stage of his career

"When Graeme Alexander came into the club it was a complete change. I hadn't experienced a change of manager before in my career and it was definitely a learning curve. He is another manager who I owe a lot of credit to because he was the first manager to give me consistent firstteam minutes.

"Naturally as a player, you want to play every minute you can but it's not as easy as that. I definitely think that helps me to appreciate the faith which he paid in me as a player. We went to Celtic Park and Ibrox and he stuck by me as a young kid which I do appreciate."

The midfielder's first goal in professional football came in April 2022 against St Mirren and this was a milestone which will stay with Cornelius for the rest of his career.

"It was so surreal to score that first





goal in my career. My dad and Uncle still joke with me now because I just froze. I couldn't believe when the ball hit the back of the net and hearing the fans sing your name is a feeling I will never forget. Walking round the pitch after the game, I saw my mum, my dad and my family which was a great feeling because you could see their pride in what you have achieved."

However, despite loving life with his boyhood club, Cornelius admits the time was right to leave the club. While a tough decision, Cornelius believes Town presented the perfect opportunity for the next stage of his career

"It was a really, really difficult decision especially given the strong bond I had with Stuart Kettlewell there. I loved playing under him and I love to see them doing well now. I felt like I wanted a fresh challenge, I wanted to come down to England and see what else is out there for me. I want to try and make a name for myself and I believe this club is a perfect fit to do just that."

Entering his first summer as a free agent, Town's number eight believes it's important to have trust in those around you.

"Straight after the season finished I took a couple of weeks off to down tools and relax. I went on holiday and when I came back it was hard not to worry about the future. My mum is a bit of a worrier and she was constantly asking about what was happening.

"I think that is where it is important to trust your agent. I had complete faith in them and those around me because I knew that things would sort themselves out and thankfully they did."

"I spoke to the gaffer at length over the phone. He spoke to me about what he liked about me, he spoke about his vision for the club, what he is like as a person and I was really impressed by what he said. I remember speaking to those around me at how well the call went. We spoke a couple of times after that and from there the deal was done almost straight away."

Despite only joining the club a matter of months ago, Cornelius believes he has already settled well.

"I am loving my time with the club. It is my first time being away from home and living on my own. I was a little bit uncertain at first but I feel so settled here now.

"Obviously, I'm still relatively new but I feel like the coaching staff have had a huge influence on me so far. I'm still adapting to a new system but they have been great in helping me do that."

"The dressing room has also played a big role in helping me to settle. It's a great group of lads, there is a sense of unity in the group and we are pulling in the same direction. I think that is massive at a football club. If everyone can come together and stick by each other then all you can get is success."

Despite putting together a run of starts to begin the season, the midfielder has been forced to spend a period on the sidelines after he fractured his wrist against Accrington. However, the Scottish midfielder is keen to ensure this doesn't impact his momentum.

"It's annoying but these things happen. There is always people worse off than me and I think I have a positive outlook on things like this. Of course, it is frustrating I was playing regularly and enjoying my football but all I have to do now is work hard and get back fit."

Looking forward to the rest of the season, Cornelius believes it's important that the club stick to their beliefs.

"If we keep plugging away, stick to our beliefs then we believe eventually the results will take care of themselves. With the quality in our squad, we are just as good as anyone in the league and all it takes is a few results to build momentum."

TOWN'S CLUB HISTORIAN PHIL HARRISON LOOKS BACK AT SOME BIG GAMES OVER THE YEARS BETWEEN THE TWO CLUBS...

SATURDAY 15 SEPTEMBER 2001 It was our first ever meeting

with Salford City but in the first qualifying round of the FA Cup at their Moor Lane ground, Kersal. Town were playing in the Northern Premier League Division One and the 'Ammies' in the North West Counties League Division One.

With a pay cheque of £7,500 to the winners, there was certainly drama during this cup tie on Saturday 15 September 2001.

The non-league paper wrote, 'After 14 minutes Salford striker Tony Carroll was involved in a clash of heads with a Harrogate defender, a collision that left him unconscious and an ambulance was driven onto the pitch which was quite a shock for the Town fans present including me.

Then seven minutes later the emergency services were back at the around after Salford's Rob Kelly twisted his ankle after attempting to retrieve the ball from off the pitch and a third City player was sent off with Town's Scott Bonsall carried off. With paramedics almost outnumbering players, the referee elected to blow the whistle and restart the game 40 minutes later.'


In the game itself, watched by 112 fans, Town took the lead in the 26th minute through Robbie Whellans (pictured top) after good work by Matt Albery and then doubled the lead ten minutes later when Stephen Ball (pictured below) smashed the ball into the net from 30 yards.

Whellans then added a third goal before the break.

Harrogate then shot themselves in the foot and conceded two poor goals in two mad minutes - the first, a pass back from a Town free kick was left short and Harry Hindle was unable to halt Nesbitt from running through on goal to square to Zane Okoro to apply the finish into the open net.

And it was a case of de ja vu a minute later from an identical free kick and position, where the ball was left short on a pass back to Hindle and again Okoro raced clear to make it 3-0 and put the game out of site for the Town boys.

It was a disappointing couple of minutes for Town in a game they controlled for large periods and a real learning curve for the lads in a period of the game where they were punished.

Former Manchester United Under-23s coach Neil Wood was appointed manager of Salford City in May 2022, replacing Gary Bowyer at the helm after a disappointing season for the Ammies saw them finish in tenth place at the end of the 2021-22 campaign, seven points off the play-offs. In what is his first managerial post, last season, the 40-year-old led the Ammies to the playoffs for the first time.

Wood oversaw the development of United players such as Di'Shon Bernard, Anthony Elanga and James Garner. He began working with the Under-13s before progressing to lead the U18s and then, from July 2019, the U23s who won promotion from PL2 Division 2 in his first season with the group.

As a player, Wood started his player career at Manchester United and had loans at Burnley and Coventry City and also played for Blackpool and Oldham Athletic. After a spell at Aston Villa, he

Jamaican international, Curtis Tilt signed for the Ammies in July from Wigan Athletic.

Curtis started off in non-league before catching the eye of then-National League side Wrexham. He only spent a year with the Welsh side, and it ended on loan at Forest Green Rovers who won the play-off final to win promotion to the EFL for the first time. Tilt signed for League One Blackpool and over the next three years made 111 appearances for the Seasiders. In January 2020 he signed for Rotherham United, but having only made one appearance joined Wigan on loan the following season. He returned to the Latics on loan another two times before signing permanently in January 2022.

LUKE BOLTON

Winger Luke Bolton signed for Salford in January 2022 from boyhood club Manchester City.

Coming up through the City ranks from a young age, he was a regular for the Under-21s before going out on loan to experience senior football. His first stop was a spell at Wycombe Wanderers followed by a temporary move to Luton Town, and in 2020-21 a move north of the border for a spell at Dundee United. Last season the 23-year-old scored six goals and made 11 assists in 54 appearances and caused problems for many of the league's defences. Bolton was a regular for England at youth level, and was part of the 2017 Toulon Tournament-winning England Under-20 sauad.

CONOR MCALENY

Former Everton trainee, Conor McAleny, 31, joined Salford in 2021 after a seasonlong stint with Oldham Athletic

At Everton, Conor impressed and was called up into the first team squad on a number of occasions, making his debut in December 2011. Over the next few seasons, he had a number of loan moves at Cardiff City, Wigan Athletic and Oxford United where he scored 10 goals in 18 appearances in the second half of the 2016-17 season. That form prompted a move to Fleetwood Town where he spent three years, as well as having loan spells at Kilmarnock and Shrewsbury Town before making the move to Boundary Park where he grabbed 21 goals in 46 appearances in 2020-21

CALLUM HENDRY

Signing in July 2021 from St Johnstone, the 25-year-old quickly made an impression on Ammies supporters in his first season at the Club, finishing as top scorer after a flurry of goals in the second half of the campaign.

His career started in the Blackburn Rovers academy, from where he had a loan spell at Clitheroe in 2015. After his release from Ewood Park in 2017. he signed for St Johnstone where he spent five years and had loan spells at Brechin City, Aberdeen and Kilmarnock. He will be most fondly remembered by Saints fans for his form at the end of 2021-22 when he scored 9 goals in 18 games to keep them in the SPL

May 2023 saw the highest number of registrations since GAMSTOP's inception and nationally data from the first half of the 2023 highlighted a 30% growth in registrations from 16-24 year-olds (21% of registrations). Over 400,000 people have registered with GAMSTOP since it launched 5 years ago. The data also shows that 50% of registrants chose to exclude themselves for five years, the maximum exclusion period that GAMSTOP offer.






