Kerry said: "I think we have a really strong squad. Right across the board there is competition for places which is what we wanted to build at the start of the summer.

"The lads are starting to build their understanding of each other, coming in you can see those connections are building and I think we are in a really good place."

With both Matty Daly and Matty Foulds making their loan spells permanent, Kerry is pleased that the club have managed to build on improvements made in the January transfer window.

"Last January was a great window for us. We strengthened in a number of key areas and

our form from then showed iust where we were at. The experience of guys like Anthony O'Connor, Tom Eastman and Levi Sutton was mixed with characters like Kazeem Olaigbe and it blended well.

"Part of my job is to plan ahead. I am always looking at who is out of contract, who could help improve the squad and then it's all about identifying targets as early as possible.

"From there, we can make approaches to gaents and players because we are always looking to get deals done guickly. That is something which definitely worked in our favour over the course of the summer"

With summer signing Matty Daly shining in our last home match against Salford, Town's recruitment chief believes this performance is a sign of things to come in the yellow & black.

"I think Matty is a really important signing for us. He proved last season with his eight goals that

> he can score goals at this level. Already this season, he has picked up a couple of assists and you can see that he is an intelligent footballer.

"When the opportunity came to sign him

permanently we moved quickly. We have given him the opportunity to play and you can see he is enjoying his football. In our last home match against Salford, you could see the quality which he possesses and hopefully now he can kick on."

Looking back at this time last season, Kerry believes the improvement is clear.

"I think we have a stronger sauad than we had this time last season. We have more options across the pitch and the competition for places is great. I also think we have a good mixture of experience at this level alongside some promising talents who look really exciting.

"At left-back, we lost Jahiem Headley in January after Huddersfield recalled him. We had to bring a left-back in and Matty Foulds became available. He is a really good player and as a staff we really like his qualities.

"Coming into this window, we wanted to keep key players like Matty Foulds, Matty Daly and Tom Eastman. Thankfully we managed to get two of the those over the line, but unfortunately with Easty, it just didn't happen.

"We expressed our interest and did everything we could to bring him back here. However, he has a family and kids who are in school so there was a lot of things to be taken in to consideration.

"We always knew that it was going to be difficult, we were always preparing for in case it didn't happen and thankfully we managed to bring in a top quality replacement in Rod McDonald."

While pleased with the calibre of our new signings, Kerry admits the timing of our business could not have been any better. "He was part of a really solid back four during the second half of last season and when we had the opportunity to make it permanent it just made sense. Of course, we have Liam Gibson who can play in there too but having that calibre of competition bodes well for the season ahead."

Speaking further on the addition of Liam Gibson, the former Town midfielder said: "There was a lot of interest in Liam. We knew of clubs at our level who were keen but there was also clubs at the level above who wanted him. Location wise I think it played into our hands, he is a North East lad but he was also impressed by the vision of the club which the management had.

"We are all really pleased to have him in. He has shown his quality since the start of the season and I think he will be a really good player for us moving forward."


With a resolute backline in the final months of last season, Kerry has revealed that the club were keen to build on that in the current campaign.

"We identified players who we thought who could carry that defensive solidity on moving forward and so far I think we are showing signs that this group can do that.

"That's my job and I make a list of potential players to do that and with Rod we signed a player who had just won the Player of the Year award with Crewe last season.

"We knew exactly what we were getting in terms of ability. Off the pitch, he is a clear leader which is what we wanted to bring in. We are absolutely delighted to have him, as soon as we knew that he was keen to join the whole process moved quickly and thankfully he joined us."

With the club adding several experienced players in the early weeks of the transfer window, Kerry believes this strong start allowed the club to continue to improve.



"We knew the positions we needed to fill and the players who we wanted to do that. I think it helped to get a couple of experienced lads in early. Looking elsewhere, I believe that helped us to attract more good players because they could see that we were serious in what we were trying to do.

"Someone like Dean Cornelius, we watched a lot of footage on him. I went to Scotland to watch him play in person so when we had the chance to get him in, we had to move quickly. Dean wanted an opportunity in England so I think we were a good fit for each other."

With Cornelius being recruited from North of the border, Town's Head of Recruitment has hinted that this could be a market which will be further explored in the future.

"We do look across a number of leagues. We knew that we wanted to add someone in that position and having come across Dean he ticked all those boxes. He has good energy, he gets around the pitch well and has leadership qualities.

"For me, that is a market we have to look into and I would say Scotland is an area which we will look at more often moving forward."

Town's recruitment drive continued with the likes of James Daly and Lewis Thomas being added to our ranks in quick succession. These are players who Kerry holds high hopes for.

"We had Lewis training with us at the back end of last season and he really impressed us. He is a big lad and has a lot of really good attributes. He has to buy his time because Mark Oxley is doing really well at this point but we feel he has real potential.

"James is another player who we watched closely last season. We watched him on a number of occasions and liked what we saw. He is quick, direct and has an unbelievable work rate. Looking at all his qualities he was definitely a Harrogate Town type of player.



Those qualities are ones which can be utilisied in League Two. He adds to the healthy competition in the attacking positions. Like the rest of the forwards, he knows that he has to be bang on it when he plays or someone will take his place."

With Abraham Odoh joining from recently relegated Rochdale, Kerry admits that he was pleased by what he saw in difficult circumstances.

"We knew Kazeem probably wouldn't be coming back. Heading into the summer we wanted to add that type of player to the group. Abraham takes players on, he gets fans out their seat and excites so to bring him in permanently is a big boost for us.

"Abraham has a lot of ability and always stood out when we watched him for Rochdale. He played in a team which was low on confidence but he was always looking for the ball. We were impressed by the fact that he was always looking to make things happen and when he became available we wanted to bring him to

the football club. We feel like we can develop him as a player. We want to give him the confidence to kick on and you can see from his goal against Salford that he is starting to do that."

With only one of the club's signings joining on loan, the former Town midfielder believes the club are in a stronger position to improve.

"Naturally, I think there comes a point where you hope that a group of players can stay together. We have been able to do that by bringing in players on permanent deals. Last year I think we had too many loans and now we only have one. Of course, we want to build a squad which can gel and be settled moving forward. Signing permanent players allows us to do that as we keep movina forward."

The club's final two transfers were completed on a busy deadline day as we looked set to lose Luke Armstrong. With this in mind, Josh March and Jeremey Sivi were added



to the attacking ranks and Town's recruitment chief believes these additions leave Town with a high quality attacking line-up.

"The situation with Luke was well documented, it wasn't until the final day of the window that our valuation for him was matched From there. we had to see what was out there in terms of quality which was difficult because he is one of the best strikers in League Two.

"Josh March is someone who we knew well, Jeremy Sivi is one who we had watched for a long time so we were really happy with those signings. Circumstances dictate that Luke is still with us and we now have a really strong attacking line-up which we are looking forward to seeing in action."

While the current window may have just closed, the former Town midfielder has revealed that work is already underway to prepare for the January transfer window.

"I am still getting out there, watching players and trying to plan for the next two transfer windows. You're always looking at players in every position to see how they could develop.

"We will see where we are at around Christmas, make a list of areas where we could potentially improve and from there look to move when the window opens."

BACK IN TIME SEASON 1947/48



TOWN'S CLUB HISTORIAN PHIL HARRISON LOOKS BACK AT ANOTHER BIG GAMES FROM THE ARCHIVES...

After the War Harrogate Hotspurs, the new 'Town team', joined the West Yorkshire League Senior Division, and were allowed to continue playing at Wetherby Road. 1947/48 was their last season known as Hotspurs as they became known as Harrogate Town for 1948/49 because the title 'Hotspurs' gave no indication to other teams that they were meeting the senior club in Harrogate.

For season 1947/48, after three successive league wins for the 'Spurs', they enjoyed another big win in the West Yorkshire League Cup when they trounced Leeds University 8-3 on Saturday 31 January 1948. Goalscorers that day were Les Liggins with a hattrick, two from Maurice Hardy and further goals from George Smith, Jackie Hewitt and Geoff Lund.

Town's team v Leeds University:

Craven, Belchier, Rostron, Faulkner, Lund, Atha, G. Smith, Hewitt, Liggins, Hardy, Wrathall.

The league form from January until the end of the season saw Spurs defeated only twice in their remaining 11 games to finish fourth of 14 teams whilst they also won the Whitworth Cup (the local senior cup) beating Christ Church Old Boys 3-1 in the final at Wetherby Road in front of a crowd of 3,000. Maurice Hardy was top scorer that season with 23 goals from 25 matches.

DID YOU KNOW THAT:

George Smith scored the first ever Hotspurs goal in the 1946/47 season in an opening day 2-1 defeat to Leeds U.Y.M.I. at Wetherby Road. Les Liggins scored 47 goals from 29 games that season, still a club record today.



The second half started with both sides battling to dominate possession. On 57-minutes, Town created a good chance from a counter attack through the middle as Ben Tweed released O'Boyle but his shot flew over the crossbar. As the game really started to open up, Town extended their lead on 64-minutes as O'Bovle unleashed a powerful strike into the top corner to finish off a great team goal created by Josh Brodella and Jack Bray, On 67-minutes, Town had a golden opportunity to make it five, as Lewis Smalley was brought down in the box from a corner, Jack Bray stepped up to take the penalty but the keeper pulled off an outstanding save low to his right.

Doncaster went straight up the other end and got a second from a low shot which was well saved by Mooney but



Last season he guided the Dons to a 21st place finish.

RYAN JOHNSON

Signing in June, the 26-year-old penned a two-year deal with the Dons after leaving Stockport County, a club he helped to promotion into the EFL and a League One play-off final. Born in Birmingham, Ryan started his career in West Brom's youth system, before ioinina Stevenage in 2014.

In a five-year stint at the Hertfordshire club, Ryan made 13 league firstteam appearances and increased his experience significantly with loan spells at Boreham Wood, St Albans, Nuneaton Town and Kidderminster Harriers, who he joined permanently in 2019. His career stepped up significantly with Hartlepool United and Stockport successive promotions following.

JAKE REEVES

AFC Wimbledon re-signed Jake Reeves after his contract at Stevenage expired in June. The 30-year-old midfielder, who scored four goals in 50 appearances for Boro in their promotion winning campaign last season, previously had a five-match loan spell with the Dons in 2012 and then featured 123 times between January 2015 and May 2017, scoring four times. Reeves began his career at Brentford and has also had spells at Swindon Town, Bradford City and Notts County.He joined Stevenage in the summer of 2021.

On his return to the Cherry Red Records Stadium, Reeves was named club captain by manager Johnnie Jackson.

JAMES TILLEY

Another Summer signing, this time from Crawley Town, 25-year-old winger James Tilley is capable of playing in a number of attacking positions and has already scored seven times this season for the Dons.

His football career began in Brighton & Hove Albion's youth academy before going on to make his professional debut in May 2015. He was also loaned to League of Ireland side Cork City for six months in 2019. There was also another temporary spell with Yeovil Town, before he departed the Seagulls for Grimsby Town before moving back south to Crawley. He would go on to make 89 appearances over the course of a three-year spell.

ALI AL HAMADI

FORWARD

Iraqi international striker, Ali Al Hamadi arrived at Plough Lane in January 2023 from Wycombe Wanderers where he racked up 13 first-team appearances for the Chairboys. Moving to Toxteth in Liverpool following the breakout of the Iraq War, his football career began as he took in academy spells with both Tranmere Rovers and Swansea City.

His form for the latter earned him a pro contract before he was eventually snapped-up by Wycombe following a successful trial period in late 2020. The 21-year-old was then loaned out to Bromley during the 2021/22 campaign.

He is fresh off bagging a hattrick in the Dons 4-1 win over Tranmere on Saturday.




