ABRAHAM ODOH

AT THE AGE OF 17, MANY WOULD HAVE BELIEVED THEIR OPPORTUNITY TO PLAY FOOTBALL PROFESSIONALLY HAD PASSED. HOWEVER, FOR ABRAHAM ODOH, BELIEF AND A MOVE TO TOOTING & MITCHAM UNITED IN 2018 WAS THE SECRET TO ACHIEVING THIS DREAM.

SPEAKING ON HIS TIME WITH THE SEMI-PROFESSIONAL CLUB, ODOH BELIEVES THIS MOVE WAS ARGUABLY THE MOST IMPORTANT DECISION OF HIS CAREER SO FAR.

INTERVIEW BY NICKOLAS MCINALLY

I started in non-league football because there wasn't really any other option open to me. I wasn't in an academy and hadn't been picked up but I just wanted to play football.

"It's tough when you haven't been seen or picked up by a club. I was disappointed but I believed in my own ability and worked hard to get to where I wanted to be.

"I took part in an open trial with Tooting & Mitcham, ended up playing for the U23s for a few weeks and then made the step up to be with the first-team.

"Playing first-team, you quickly get into the habit of playing to win. I don't think that is something which U19s or U23 football could offer. I was around some experienced players as well and being in a dressing room like that helped me to understand how to act.

"The coaches there were brilliant, they created a professional environment and were strict to make sure that it stuck. That helped us to improve but it also gave me the experience of what to expect when I signed the contract with Charlton.

"It probably had a knock on impact on my game as a whole. I was training harder and making sure I went into every session as if it was a match so it definitely benefitted me."

As scouts in the local area continued to scour the non-league set up, Odoh praised the influence of his coaches to ensure he remained at the top of his game.

"There was always scouts who were watching our games and the coaches always gave us the same message. They encouraged us to put it to the back of our mind, if we thought too much into it then our performances would be impacted.

"They wanted us to play freely and see what came from that. I took that advice and the possibility of making that step up wasn't really on my mind until Charlton came in.

"That was my first experience with a professional academy so I was a little bit nervous but I knew that was where I wanted to be. After getting the first couple of sessions under my belt, those nerves disappeared and I started to show what I could do. That mindset definitely came from the coaches at Tooting & Mitcham, they encouraged us to take our opportunity when it came. They gave us the confidence that we belonged there and thankfully it helped me."

With the lure of full-time football staring the then 19-year-old in the face, Town's number 9 revealed he was desperate to make his mum proud.

"I was 19 when I went to Charlton and I was playing alongside lads who had been with the academy for a number of years. You could see a difference in skillset but I was able to bring what I learned at Tooting & Mitcham to Charlton. The chance at full-time football was definitely on my mind, I knew I could potentially change my life, change my families' life for the better.

"I ended up going on loan because I was under contract with Tooting & Mitcham and after a couple of weeks with Charlton I found out that they were going to sign me permanently. I got called in for a meeting and I can remember how nervous I felt before it. I knew I had been playing well, I felt like I stood out because I was unique to the other players.

"I remember going home and telling my mum and she was overwhelmed with emotions. She showed a lot of faith in me when I was younger, she took me to sessions every week and always put me first even if it meant cancelling plans she had. I wanted to make her proud, that has been my aim so far in my career and it's always something which I want to keep doing."

However, the hard work was only just getting started for the 23-year-old who revealed the effort he made to start strongly that first full season in professional football.

"I signed for Charlton permanently in the summer, coming back for that pre-season I knew that I had to be fitter and stronger than ever to make that step up. I took part in a lot of sessions, I was working with coaches at Tooting & Mitcham on one-to-one sessions and staying sharp.

"I spent that first summer with the first-team, I signed a bit in pre-season and the manager spoke to me about working hard and showing what I can do. I was making sure I did everything I could to avoid being complacent. I knew every day walking in that this was my chance and every day I was giving it everything I had.

"I was staying behind and doing extra every day. As a semi-professional, I was training on Tuesdays and Thursdays but now I was training and playing most days."

However, in playing first-team football every week, Odoh admits the step to U23 level was one which took some time to adapt to.

"That first season for me was all about adapting, I was watching the players around me and seeing what they were doing to prepare. I tried to take things from them and implement them into my routine.

"Physically, it took a couple of months to get used to the demands on the body. Everyday, I was getting up to go again and my legs were hurting but I got used to it after a couple of weeks.

"It was a completely different experience for me, at Tooting & Mitcham you were playing for the three points and that was all that mattered. With Charlton, the U23s were playing to improve and results were nowhere near as important."

In entering his second season with the club, Odoh admits he started to see the fruits of his labour which the previous season had allowed him to set in place.

"At the start of that second season, I felt like a different player to be honest. I felt stronger and better which transferred itself into my football. I felt more mature and ready to push for an opportunity with the first team.

"I got a start in the FA Cup and played a full ninety minutes, that was a good experience playing in front of a big crowd. I was able to see my family in the crowd and that was a really proud moment for me.

"I was a bit nervous the day before, I remember coming in to the ground and slowly relaxing into it. As soon as the match got started, it felt like just another game and against West Brom I had the chance to test myself against a good team."

However, despite the success of that second season, Odoh would leave The Valley upon the expiry of his contract and looking back Town's number 9 had feared his chance had gone.

"I had a one-year option at the end of my contract there, I had thought that the club would exercise that and send me out on loan but it just wasn't to be. I left Charlton when I was 21 and I thought that I would have to start again. After working so hard, I thought I would need to go back to non-league football and build again.

"I was a little bit older this time, I knew that if I was on trial anywhere then it would be competing to get into the first-team. My agent and the people around me were great at that time. They assured me that everything would work itself out, the fact that I hadn't been in the academy for long definitely helped me. I didn't have that attachment to the club so I could move on quickly and work on my next move.

"Rochdale spoke to my agent in that summer, they were keen to sign me and offering first-team football. He told me about the offer and what they saw for me and I was really encouraged.

"I was moving away from home but I would say that around that time I



realised that was a sacrifice I would need to make. At first it was a little bit sad, especially for my mum because I had been living there for so long but I do think I am used to it now.

"I had to prove myself with them, it took me a couple of months to do that which was challenging but the manager was always speaking with me. He kept encouraging me to work hard, he told me my chance would come and thankfully it did."

Having earned his opportunity, Odoh returned for the following pre season with the bit between his teeth to prove his worth.

"That next season, I came in and knew I would be challenging for first-team football. I was trying to train harder than the lads around me and make sure I got a good pre-season under my belt.

"I was living up here by myself, that was one of the best things about living away from home because there was no distractions and I could focus on my football.

"The manager was speaking to me during that pre-season, he reassured me that I was doing the right things and that my chance would come. That helped me to keep driving

forward and working hard, from that he gave me the nod I would be starting almost straight away.

"Of course, it's difficult when you're battling in a side that is battling down there but I used the experience I had at Tooting & Mitcham to prepare for it and leave everything out on the pitch. However, that is all part and parcel of football, I want to be in football and play regularly so sometimes you're going to go through experiences like that."

Despite a desire to drive Rochdale back into the football league, the winger would once again be on the move as Town sought to secure his services.

"I knew that there was interest in me but I put it to the back of my mind. I was preparing to go back to Rochdale and to find my feet at National League level. My agent told me of the interest from the club here and as soon as I heard about it I thought it was the best place for me to express myself. From there, everything moved quickly, the gaffer believed in me and made it clear I would have the freedom to do what I do best.

"I wanted to get away on the pre-season trip to Scotland, I thought it would give me the chance to settle and I could get to know the lads quicker."

The winger quickly endeared himself to the Town faithful by scoring the winning goal in our 3-2 victory over Salford earlier this season. Speaking on the occasion, Odoh hopes this is a sign of things to come.

"That goal against Salford felt like it was a long time coming. For me, it was important to get that feeling back and to do so in front of the fans was great. That gave me a lot of confidence in my ability to make a difference for this team.

"I am always talking to the manager and Thirs to find out what they want from me to improve. They want me in and around the box to see what happens. When that happens they back me to have that composure to make a difference and I want to repay that faith."

TOWN'S CLUB HISTORIAN PHIL HARRISON LOOKS BACK AT A MEMORABLE GAME BETWEEN THE TWO SIDES



The first time Town ever met Wrexham in competition was in the First Round proper of the FA Trophy on Saturday 16 December 2017 at the Racecourse Ground.

The Dragons, under Dean Keates, were a Vanarama National League side and lying third in the table, whilst Town, under Simon Weaver, were second in the National League North. Town had already seen off Darlington 3-2 in the third qualifying round.

In front of a crowd of 1,370, Town won the game 2-0 thanks to a brace from Mark Beck, a new signing in early November from Darlington who had been brought in to help the club out with Simon Ainge and Dominic Knowles out injured. Beck had previously been at Wrexham on loan during 2015/16.

Town eventually went out to Billericay Town in a Third Round proper replay having reached the last sixteen for the first time in their history.

Wrexham finished the campaign 10th with Chris Holroyd finishing top scorer with 13 league and cup goals whilst Town finished second in the National League North with Joe Leesley top scoring with 22 goals.

Town went on to earn promotion to the National League via the play-offs beating Brackley Town 3-0 in the

play-off final at Wetherby Road before a crowd of 3,000.

The club's met for the first time in League action the following season with a 0-0 draw at Wetherby Road and Wrexham winning 2-1 at the Racecourse Ground as well as also meeting in the FA Cup with Wrexham taking the honours. This was the season Town became fully professional and introduced the new Club Crest.

Odoh visited Richard Taylor School, inspiring a cohort of girls taking part in Town's Trailblazers intervention.

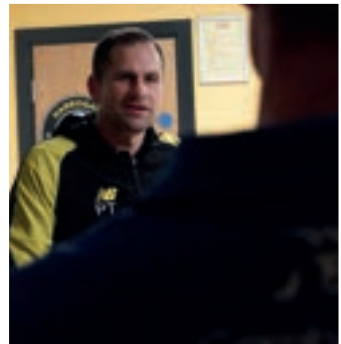

An injury time goal from Jack Bray saw Town complete a come-back win over Northampton Town at Sixfields Stadium in the FA Youth Cup and set up a home tie with Brighton & Hove Albion for Rory McArdle's side in the Third Round.

Matty Ireland had given the young Cobblers' an early 6th minute lead, but goals from Elijah Samuels midway through the second half and a late added time strike by Jack Bray turned it round for Town.

The Cobblers made a dominant start with James Owen poking wide of

the post in the opening 60 seconds and Harry Guess having a half-volley tipped over by Alex Mooney in the Town goal three minutes later. The hosts, however, were rewarded for their positive start when they took an early lead, Ireland finishing from close range after Dobson's fierce drive across goal was palmed out by Mooney. Ireland then had a chance to extend the home side's lead when his first-time effort from a cutback was blocked by Lewis Smalley before Reuben Wyatt curled narrowly into the top right from Owen's low

corner as the Cobblers continued to dominate the first 15 minutes.

After the quick start by Northampton, however, Town started to grow into the game as the contest became more even midway through the opening 45 minutes, Harrogate creating their first chance when Jack Bray cut inside and had a powerful strike blocked by Josh Tomlinson.

The hosts were still in the ascendency in terms of opportunities, captain Jacob Scott's audacious bicycle kick from Wyatt's whipped cross being turned behind by Mooney, Tom Cartwright curling wide of the far post having checked back onto his left foot and Hart almost catching the 'keeper out with a cross-shot that flew across the face of goal.

However, momentum shifted on the stroke of half-time when Tomlinson brought Bray down in the D and was adjudged to have denied a goalscoring opportunity. The defender was shown a straight red card as a result. Ollie Nicholson took the resulting free-kick, but his effort flicked the wall and looped over, before Town spurned two golden opportunities to equalise from the resulting corner.

The Cobblers managed to survive until half-time, but they remained under pressure in the opening stages of the second period as Town came out pushing for the equaliser.



Jack Bray was denied by Marcus Bald in the Cobblers' goal, gathering his shot on the turn at the second attempt.

Town did however deservedly draw level soon after in the 68th-minute when Elijah Samuels flicked Nicholson's cross home from close range.

The Cobblers settled into a defensive shape given their man disadvantage, the pace of the game and the number of opportunities dwindling as a result.

Town were now in total control and forcing the Cobblers into a defensive shape with their man advantage and creating

numerous opportunities to take the lead. Substitute Ollie Robinson drove a cross from the byline straight into Bald's arms at the near post and Nicholson curled a yard wide from long range. However, Town's pressure finally told in the first minute of added time when Josh Brodella's curled shot hit the inside of the post and Bray smashed in the follow-up from around the penalty spot to give Rory McArdle's boys a fantastic win.

PDC UPDATE



WITH JOSH WALSH, TOWN'S YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PHASE LEAD

As we enter the winter months, the fact that we can have two sites for our PDC in Harrogate is fantastic. We are looking at ways in which we can grow and I believe that this new site we have at Rossett Sports Centre has given us a fantastic platform to do just that.

We believe it is really important that we continue to adopt an environment where young people can continue to enjoy and learn. At such a young age, children don't enjoy being outside in adverse weather conditions. With the indoor facilities at Rossett, we can now move them inside so they can enjoy the sessions more as they don't have to stand outside in the cold.

St John Fishers has really gone from strength to strength in recent years, and for us as a football club, we are really pleased to see this. Now, with the support of the facilities at Rossett, we have a base solely for the younger age groups.

We have now been able to relaunch our Junior PDC, and with that, we can now improve what we offer at the PDC. The children of Harrogate and the surrounding areas now have more pathways available to them from the club.

We are also really pleased with the fact that we are now offering more opportunities for the children in the area to represent their local football club. In doing that, I think it's a huge benefit for the community and the club. Since the PDC was formed, one of our long-term goals has always been to get more and more children representing the club through playing and training.

Our recent Soccer Camp presented another great opportunity for the children of Harrogate to enjoy playing football. We are always keen to ensure that this is a club run event and the support we have received from across the club has been fantastic. We are seeing more and more of our U16s and Academy Scholars coming along to help out in the coaching. The first-team players and staff are also hugely supportive and come along to sessions to support the work we are doing.

With all that going on, we are really pleased with the way these camps are

run, but more importantly, it's about the way they are received from the children and parents who come along.

In having the younger players helping out with the delivery of these camps, it promotes a fantastic image for those who are in the PDC and on their journey with the club. And with that, we are also showing the U16s and Academy players more about the identity of the football club. There is very much a shared belief in this club - if you're a part of it, then you're a part of it all. That might be the Soccer Camps, the PDC, as a parent, player or coach but everyone is pulling together.

With our presence as a professional football club, we have a magnificent opportunity to stand out from the crowd with the pathway we have in place. Right from the Junior PDC to the club's Academy and subsequently the first-team, we want to have as many local kids representing the club as possible.

It has been great to work alongside Josh Falkingham, Rory McArdle and Josh Law since they joined us as coaches here in the PDC. They have all got their own individual strengths and I believe they complement each other well.

Rory is an ex-international level defender. He is speaking directly to our children in the PDC, sharing his experiences with them and helping them to improve. Falks is a leader and the captain of our football club - he has played at Wembley and experienced promotion so he is a fountain of knowledge to tap into whilst Josh is a fantastic coach and puts so much effort and detail into every session. For the children in the PDC to be working with him every week is hugely important to allow them to reach their potential.

Of course, the lads are working with some fine coaches themselves who are helping them to strike that bond with the kids in the PDC. Falks and Rory are still early in their coaching careers but you can see them watching a lot of sessions. They are learning a lot and asking a lot of questions and to see them having that bond with their fellow coaches as well as the players in the PDC is really fantastic.

I'd like to round things off by discussing our games programme. We have just finished another block and I really believe we are starting to see the benefits of that. PDC players have the opportunity to play for Harrogate Town, and that is brilliant.

We are playing against some real top quality opposition and are competing well. Recently our U16s faced Hull City and Barnsley whilst the younger age groups played Rotherham United. Coming up, we have games against Sheffield Wednesday. We can't replicate matches and the information these games give our coaches is fantastic. We have a curriculum which we run off, however, if something is noticed in a game, then the coaches have the freedom to change their session to better meet the needs of their squad.

IN THE DUGOUT

PHIL PARKINSON

APPOINTED: JULY 2021 | AGE: 55

Parkinson, 55, has become highly respected in the game during a managerial career that has seen him take charge of six different clubs. During his time in the dug-out, Parkinson – who also played more than 500 league games in an 18-year playing career – has won promotion on four occasions.

As a player, Parkinson came through the youth ranks at Southampton, before making his Football League debut with Bury and then spending more than a decade with Reading.

At the conclusion of his playing career, his first managerial job was at Colchester United, who he led to

promotion to the Championship in 2006. He moved to Hull City and then Charlton Athletic – joining the latter as first an assistant, before replacing Alan Pardew as manager. In his next managerial job, at Bradford City, Parkinson led the Bantams to the 2012/13 League Cup Final and promotion to League One at the end of the same season, before memorably beating Chelsea in the FA Cup at Stamford Bridge the following campaign.

Parkinson earned the third promotion of his career, with Bolton Wanderers, in 2016/17 and has since managed Sunderland before guiding Wrexham back to the EFL last season after a 15 year absence



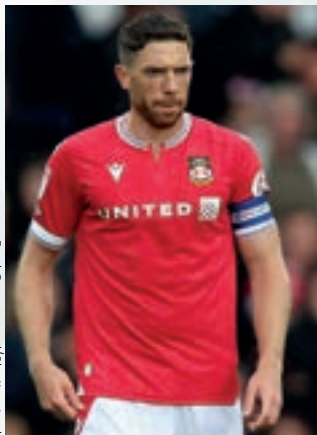

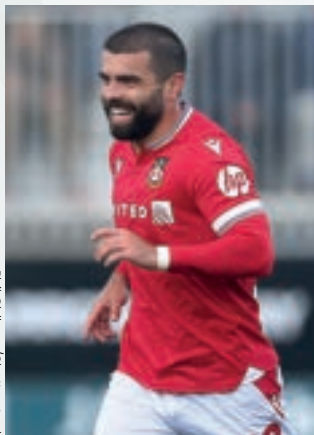

Signing in August 2021 from Cheltenham, the centre-back started his youth career at Swindon and then Newcastle United where he made two senior appearances in the 2009/10. After two loan spells at Northampton, Tozer left St James' Park for a permanent deal at Sixfields and went on to play more than 100 times for the Cobblers. Spells at Yeovil and Newport County followed, before Tozer joined Cheltenham and helped them secure promotion to League One.

At Wrexham, Tozer's influence saw him named as Club Captain and the 33-year-old played in all 46 league matches last season as Wrexham lifted the National League title and has again been almost ever-present this term.

MID

Signing in Summer 2022, the former West Ham United academy graduate signed from Luton Town, with whom he was part of their double promotion from League Two to the Championship.

After loan moves at Oxford United and Charlton Athletic in the last two seasons, he decided to join Wrexham. Lee, 28, - son of former England international Robert, scored 27 goals in 113 games for the Hatters and arrived in Wrexham having netted 44 career goals in 219 games, including one in the Europa League with West Ham. Last season, he made 45 appearances in the National League, scoring 12 times whilst this season he is currently the clubs top marksman with 10 goals.

PAUL MULLIN

FWD

Mullin, 29, began his youth career at Liverpool before moving to Huddersfield Town in 2012 and then Morecambe in 2014 where he made his first pro appearance that August. He went on to play for the Shrimps until 2017, where he scored 25 goals in 122 appearances before heading to Swindon Town for the 2017/18 season. Mullin then returned north to Tranmere for 2018/19.

He spent time on loan at Cambridge United before making the move permanent in the Summer of 2020. 2020/21 saw Mullin voted League Two Player of the Season as he hit an emphatic 32 goals as The U's were promoted to League One.

In July 2021, Mullin - who turned down a new deal with Cambridge - joined Wrexham and finished his first season with 32 goals in all competitions.

Those exploits were replicated last season with Mullin appearing in every league match during the season, scoring 38 goals as he fired the Red Dragons to the National League title.

OLLIE PALMER

FWD

The 6'5" striker began life with Woking, signing pro with the Cards in 2010 and had loan spells with Boreham Wood and St Albans City before joining Havant & Waterlooville. In 2013, Palmer moved to Mansfield Town and after a loan spell with Grimsby Town in 2015, signed for Leyton Orient that Summer. After stints with Lincoln City and Crawley Town, the 31-year-old joined AFC Wimbledon in the summer of 2020, scoring 13 goals in his 18 months there.

In January 2022, Wrexham broke their transfer record to acquire the striker and the striker scored 16 goals after his arrival in January. Since then, Palmer has struck up a vital partnership with fellow frontman Paul Mullin, with the duo a key component in Wrexham's title-winning side.

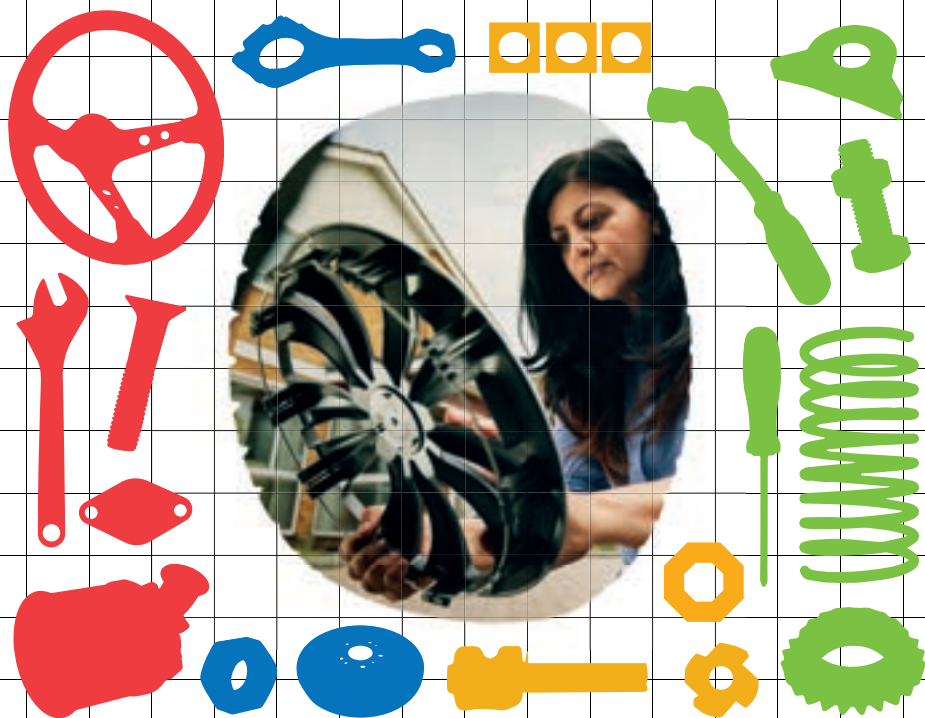
