JONATHAN MITCHELL

HAVING PREVIOUSLY TAKEN SEVERAL MONTHS AWAY FROM FOOTBALL, GOALKEEPER JONATHAN MITCHELL ADMITS A RETURN TO ACTION IN OUR AWAY VICTORY OVER WALSALL LAST MONTH HELPED TO REIGNITE HIS PASSION FOR FOOTBALL.

THE FORMER DONCASTER MAN HAD BEEN WITHOUT A CLUB FOLLOWING HIS RELEASE FROM THE ROVERS IN THE SUMMER. HOWEVER, LOOKING BACK ON HIS TOWN DEBUT MITCHELL ADMITS HIS DEBUT COULDN'T HAVE GONE MUCH BETTER.

“Those battling performances have really reignited my fire and excitement for football. There is nothing quite like it and I feel really determined to keep playing and hopefully earn a longer term deal.

“I took six months away from football before signing for Harrogate and I have absolutely loved it since signing here. The time away was really good for me mentally, I didn't really go to many football matches because I used the time to take a break which I think has helped me massively.

“The break helped me to realise just how much I have in life alongside my football. Of course, we are extremely fortunate to call this a job but I can now step back and see the bigger picture which is really important.

“The clean sheet and the win was an ideal start. It gave me a lot of confidence and working with the

lads in front of me that has helped to build that confidence.

“The way we defend, the lads are putting their bodies on the line every week and I do feel like I have grown in confidence by playing with them.”

As the 29-year-old reflects on his early career, Mitchell believes the opportunity to play several sports allowed him to further improve his footballing ability.

“I started outfield when I was younger but I quickly realised that I enjoyed diving around and using my hands. When I was at school, I also played rugby and cricket so there was a little bit of a crossover there which made going in goal a natural progression.

“I think playing all different sports definitely helps. I would advise anyone to play as many sports as they can because the benefits it has to your fitness and coordination is fantastic.

"I stopped playing them when I had the opportunity to sign for Newcastle full-time. I was around 15/16 at the time but I thought that chance at full-time football was too good to turn down."

"I was playing for the Town school's team, we were playing Newcastle school's team and I think they actually had a scout at the game. After that, I got invited down and took part in a couple of sessions and from there things moved pretty quickly."

Soon after joining The Toon, the goalkeeper quickly began a fast tracked route to success which included an appearance for the club's reserve side while Mitchell still at school.

Speaking on the occasion, Town's number 21 believes this was an important learning curve.

"There was a couple of injuries with the guys who normally play for the reserves at the time. The U18s had a Youth Cup game the next day and I was drafted in to play for the reserves. It was exciting because I got a day off school from it.

"I think I did alright in the game to be honest against Manchester City. I really enjoyed the experience and went back to school the next day."

"From there, during my two-year scholarship I was in and around the reserve team quite a lot. I had the opportunity to train with the first-team a few times which was great.

"I was offered a professional deal on the back of that which was really exciting. It was the next step for me and it gave me another opportunity to show that I was good enough to go out and play professionally."

For many, Christmas Day is an occasion for family and friends. However, the goalkeeper recalls a Christmas Day spent preparing for what would be his first senior appearance with Workington.

"It was a really good opportunity to go to Workington and play football. The first loan spell came from

nowhere really. I got the phone call on Christmas Day to say that they needed a goalkeeper for the next game.

"I ended up putting a run of seven games together over that period. It was miles away from where I was staying so I only travelled for games but it was really good.

"I was playing Conference North at the time and I really enjoyed it. I felt as ready as I could be to play men's football. It was the first time I had really experienced playing to win but I embraced it.

"That felt like the next step of my progression to be honest. After that experience, I felt a better player because I was playing alongside experienced professionals. Coming from a club like Newcastle there is a pressure to perform which I had to deal with and achieve."

Despite two successful loan spells, Mitchell received news that his contract with Newcastle would not be extend. However, his next opportunity in the professional game was just around the corner.

"Thankfully, I was offered the chance to go and train with Derby County as they prepared to take part in the playoffs. My season ended with Newcastle and the next week I was out trying to impress for a contract.

"I do think I was quite lucky with that and they told me then that they would like to keep me. That meant I was going into the close season knowing that my future for the season after had already been taken care of.

"I was moving away from home for the first-time and during that close season my parents and I were invited down to meet the family who I would be staying with."

Having grown up a Hartlepool supporter, Mitchell recalls his Derby debut against non-other than his boyhood club.

"It's funny really because when I was younger I had supported Hartlepool

and even had a season ticket to go to games but I ended up making my debut for Derby against them in the FA Cup.

"Going to Derby, I was always in and around the first-team and they had two experienced keepers in Lee Grant and Scott Carson. Working with them and Eric Steele I felt like I had improved a lot in a relatively short period of time.

"The chance to play for Derby in the FA Cup was brilliant. I was playing against my home town club and one which a lot of my friends and family had supported. I didn't even tell my mum and dad I was playing but I knew they would be there.

"We had a game the following Tuesday so it was straight back down to get ready for that but I did get a chance to see them briefly after. That was a good experience but from there the game quickly moved on and I was all about trying to break into the team again."

"Of course, being around two keepers like Lee Grant and Scott Carson meant that would be a tough ask. They were two top quality keepers but personally for me they were great to be around.

"They were brilliant to be around, if I had any questions I knew I could ask them and they would look after me. However, the one thing that stands out clear as day for me is just how well they trained.

"Every session, they brought an intensity and a mindset which rubbed off on the people around them and since then I have always tried to attack each session with that same level of intensity."

With the challenge of regular football firmly at the front of Mitchell's mind, a loan move to League Two side Luton Town quickly followed.

"The move to Luton was another one which came from nowhere. We were away in a hotel getting ready for a game the next day and as soon as I heard I felt real levels of excitement and ended up signing on the Friday.



“By the time I got down there and into the hotel, I hadn’t had a chance to train with the team. I went straight in on the Saturday and we ended up winning 1-0 away at Leyton Orient.

“That was a great feeling to make my league debut and keep a clean sheet. I ended up only playing six games but it gave me a lot of confidence in my ability to play football league.

“Lee Grant needed an operation and that meant I was recalled early to be cover on the bench for Scott Carson. I remember going back there and feeling confident in my ability but I knew I would have to wait for the opportunity to play.

“Of course, that didn’t happen and

Granty came back but it was the end of the season and I couldn’t get back out on loan so I had to wait until the next season.”

The following season, Mitchell would again be on the move to Northampton. However, relegation to League Two left a bitter taste in the goalkeeper’s mouth.

“Northampton was a really good opportunity for me to play. They had just got promoted to League One and I went in knowing that I would have to prove myself once again to fight for the shirt with Steve Arnold.

“To be fair, myself and Arnie got on really well and he was really unlucky with injuries. We changed a few times over the course of the season

and unfortunately we got relegated which is never nice to experience but it just a learning experience.”

“I went back to Derby and knew that performances for Northampton hadn’t really been good enough to warrant a new contract unfortunately. The club had started to go through financial issues so I had a sense that I would be leaving.”

A short six month spell with Hartlepool would follow before Mitchell would again be battling it out for the number one jersey at League One side Doncaster Rovers.

“I signed as cover for Doncaster who were 10 points from safety. I got the nod after a couple of games and it felt great to be back playing so quickly. I managed to get a run of games and we went on a bit of a run but unfortunately it wasn’t enough and we got relegated.

“I managed to start the next season as the number one, I ended up playing 40 odd games on the bounce which was really good for me personally. There was a managerial change at the end of the season and unfortunately I was told that I wasn’t part of his plans.”

After overcoming that disappointment, the 29-year-old admits he feels in a stronger place mentally after signing for Town.

“The Gaffer, Phil and Thirs have all been brilliant with me. Their instructions have been simple, they want me to help to contribute to the team while also enjoying my football.

“Coming in, you want to have a positive impact and I hope for the most part I have done that. Obviously, the goal against Crawley was disappointing but in the game against Wrexham I felt like I had put things right. Hopefully, that can continue in the next couple of weeks.

“I don’t want to look too far ahead. There is a lot of important matches to come and in the past I would overthink things so I want to stay in the here and now. To do that, it’s about taking things one thing at a time, starting with sessions and then with matches.”

WE'VE MET BEFORE



TOWN'S CLUB HISTORIAN PHIL HARRISON LOOKS BACK AT A MEMORABLE GAME BETWEEN THE TWO SIDES



The first time Town, under Simon Weaver ever met Notts County under Neil Ardley (now at York City) was in the Vanarama National League in the 2019/20 season.

At the end of 2018/19, Notts were relegated from the Football League for the first time in their history having been one of the 12 founding members in 1888 and are presently still the world's oldest 'Football League Club'.

Our first fixture was at home in early August 2019 with The Magpies leaving Wetherby Road with a 2-0 win. The reverse fixture never took place due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

In 2019/20, Town and Notts finished second and third respectively behind Champions, Barrow on a PPG basis and both went on to reach

the National League Play-Off Final after Town beat Boreham Wood 1-0 and Notts beat Barnet 2-0 in their respective Semi-Finals. The Final itself took place on Sunday 02 August at Wembley and was Town's first ever visit. Unfortunately there were no fans present due to the pandemic.

The match resulted in a 3-1 victory for Town with first half goals from George Thomson and Connor Hall putting Harrogate in control until Callum Roberts replied for Notts just before half time. Town added a third in the second half through Jack Diamond and earn promotion to the EFL for the first time in their history.

The two sides also reached the FA Trophy Semi-Final that season which was due to be played on 21 March 2020, however, was also postponed due to the pandemic. The tie was eventually played at Meadow Lane the following season in September 2020 and Town won 1-0 to reach the FA Trophy Final for the first time and book a second visit to Wembley, where they beat Concorde Rangers 1-0 in May 2021 to lift the trophy.

Brighton and Hove Albion U18s showed their quality in front of 500 supporters at The EnviroVent Stadium to knock Town out of the FA Youth Cup in Round Three, running out 4-1 winners.

The Premier League outfit's wingers carried most of the early threat as they showed off their pace and trickery, with the visitors patient build up play looking to get them in positions where they could attack the full backs.

Jack Bray was the first in yellow and black to have a go at goal, receiving the ball from Robbie Wilson before cutting inside onto his right foot and bending wide of the top corner.

Brighton opened the scoring in the 28th minute in a clever move that was finished off by Joe Knight. Charlie Tasker and Remiero Moulton were both involved down the right with Moulton's final pass putting Knight in a great position to fire across Alex Mooney into the inside netting.

Josh Law and Rory McArdle's side responded well to going behind with Ollie Nicholson unlucky not to level just two minutes later having seen his effort cleared from the line.

Brighton would get a second before the half was done though, and there was nothing Harrogate keeper Mooney could do about it. Harry Mills' left-footed effort curling into the corner at pace.

Town had a chance to pull a goal back early in the second half as a free kick into the box fell nicely for James Moorby, but the defender couldn't guide his attempt home.

Mooney was then in fine form to keep Brighton from getting a third after he kept out Sahil Bashir's attempt at the near post with the Seagulls Mills' pass releasing the winger.

Town were convinced they had pulled a goal back in the 71st minute as Cadarn Taylor's looping header was caught by Lorenz Ferdinand falling

backwards. The Brighton stopper looked to be behind the line, but neither the referee or his assistant signalled for a goal.

Just seconds later Brighton claimed their third, Bashir again looking bright down the left and forcing Mooney into a save, though this time Ronnie Gorman was there to tap home the rebound.

Conceding a third didn't stop Town deservedly getting on the scoresheet though as Bray expertly glanced home a header with 15 minutes still to play after great work from Wilson on the right.

Brighton restored their three goal lead with ten minutes to play though as Moulton cut inside from the right and found the bottom corner at the second attempt after Mooney had saved his initial effort.

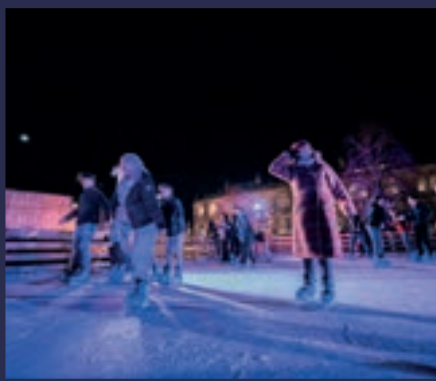



APPOINTED: JUNE 2022 | AGE: 42

Now in his second season as County's head coach having masterminded their return to the EFL in his first year in charge, Williams was appointed in June 2022 following the departure of Ian Burchnall.

Prior to accepting the role he had been assistant head coach to Russell Martin at Swansea City, while he also had experience as a head coach from his time at Swindon Town.

His first major role came as Brighton and Hove Albion Under 21s manager, which led to his appointment as Mark Cooper's assistant at League One Swindon in 2013. The pair led the Robins to the play-off final in 2014-15, losing out to Preston

North End, and Williams continued in his role until taking the caretaker manager's role in 2015 and following an excellent run of results, was handed a five-year contract as the club's head coach.

Unfortunately, however, Williams' control over footballing affairs was limited and Swindon found themselves dropping into League Two and the mutual termination of Williams' contract.

Williams became head coach of Bristol City's Under 23s, before teaming up with the newly-appointed Martin as his assistant at MK Dons before following him to the Championship when Swansea came calling.

A short-term deal at Cheltenham preceded a return to Willem II, before returning to England with Morecambe in January.

But playing opportunities proved limited for Jones at the Kassam and he joined Notts on loan to kickstart his career.

The 36-year-old joined Notts ahead of this season from Derby County after a great season at Pride Park, notching 15 goals for the Rams.

The forward progressed through Notts' academy and made his senior debut aged just 16 in 2004 before then-Premier League side Southampton signed him. After returning to Notts on loan in 2005/06, he finished Saints' top scorer in 2008/09 earning a £1m move to Nottingham Forest and, while his City Ground career never really got going, a loan move to Coventry City sparked his goalscoring into life as he bagged 16 from 22 appearances.

He returned to the Championship in the New Year with a loan to Ipswich Town, a move which was made permanent the following season and went on to score 45 goals in 159 appearances for the Tractor Boys before signing for Sheffield United ahead of the 2018-19 campaign.

McGoldrick went on to rack up 63 Premier League appearances for United, scoring 10 top-flight goals before departing for Derby at the end of that season.

McGoldrick also boasts 14 Republic of Ireland caps.

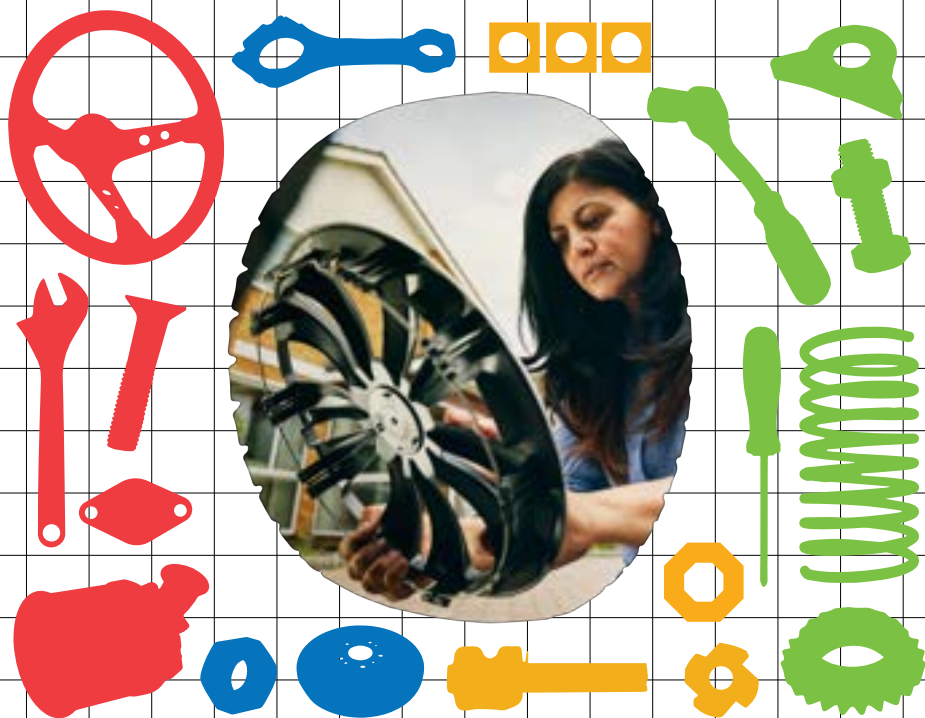
