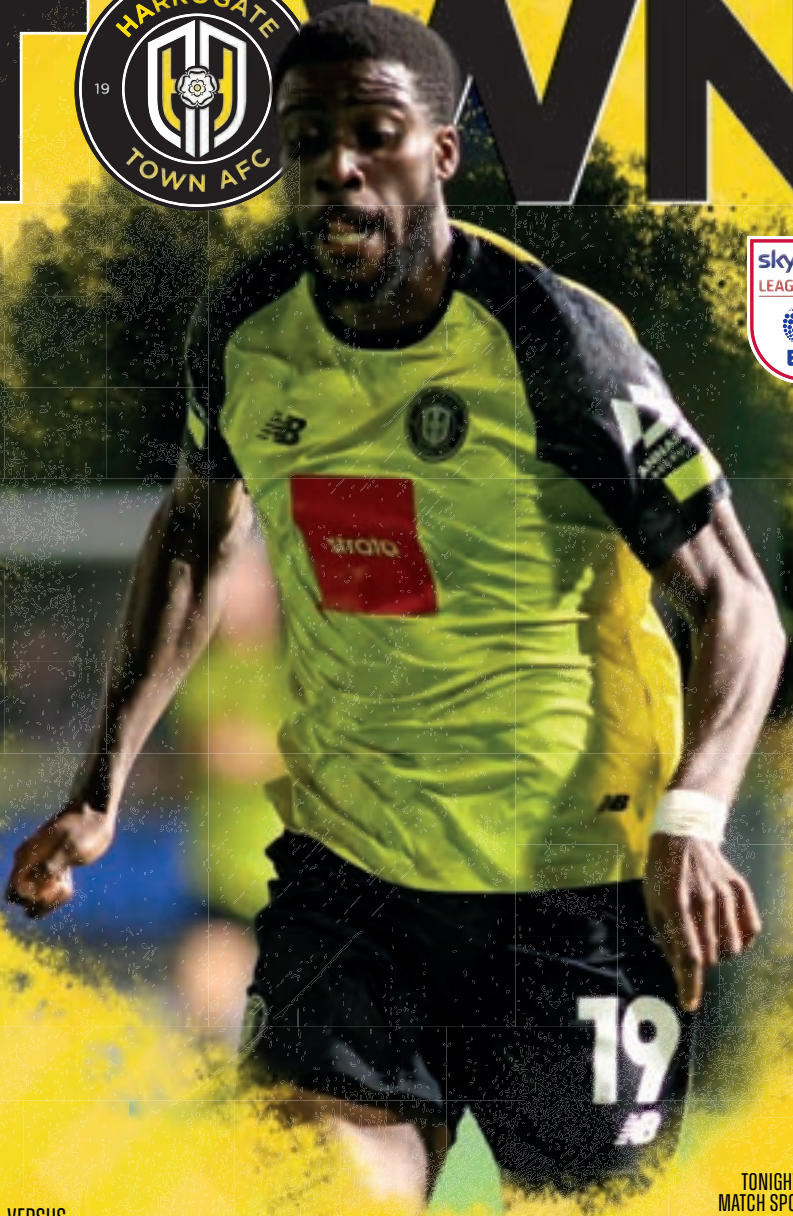

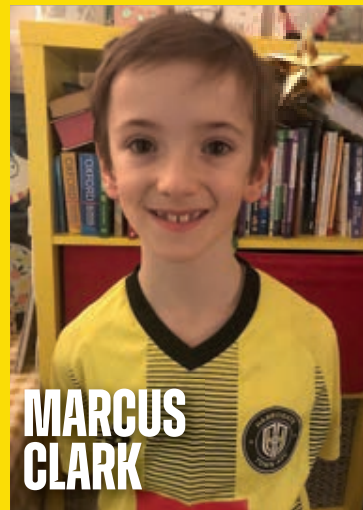

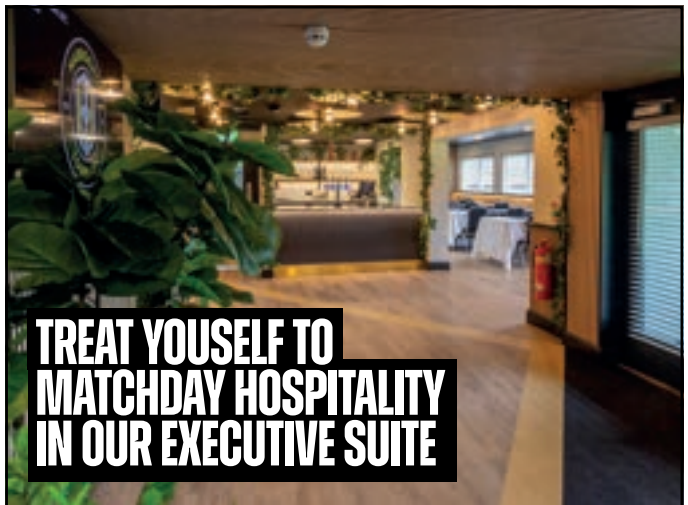

JEREMY SIVI

TOWN LOANEE JEREMY SIVI BELIEVES A RESILIENT MINDSET AND HARD WORK HELPED HIM TO OVERCOME THE DISAPPOINTMENT OF BEING RELEASED BY LEYTON ORIENT IN 2020.

THE EAST LONDON BORN WINGER BEGAN HIS CAREER WITH ORIENT. HOWEVER, FOLLOWING A TWO-YEAR SCHOLARSHIP WITH THE CLUB'S ACADEMY, HE WAS SUBSEQUENTLY RELEASED.

Speaking on that set back, Sivi said: "I was around 12 or 13 years old playing for my Sunday league team in East London and thankfully from there I ended up getting picked up and invited into training.

"That was a really good experience for me, I started out there when I was very young and spent a good few years there. I worked my way up and eventually was offered a scholarship to play there for two years which was really good for me because it was challenging.

"I was fortunate enough to be offered the chance to go out on loan with Harlow and play men's football for the first time. It gave me an insight into what to expect from that environment which I really enjoyed. Everyone there welcomed me with

open arms, they helped me to settle in and for me it was just about adapting to a new environment to get the best out of myself.

"However, I went there with six months left on my contract and definitely felt an added level of pressure to perform. At that point, I was still growing and finding ways to deal with the pressure in football and looking back it was definitely an experience which benefitted me."

Following his release, the winger admits there was a time where he thought the professional dream had passed him by. However, he credits family and friends for being a driving factor in regaining motivation.

"Of course, I was disappointed not to be offered a professional contract and anyone who has been though it knows that feeling. There was a point

where I thought that my chance had gone but I am thankful for the people around me because they kept me going and helped me get through that.

"After being released, I decided not to get a job and instead dedicated all my spare time into training and improving as a player. I ended up going a year without a club and in that time, it was important not to get too far ahead of myself.

"Every day I went out there aiming to be better than the day before. You can't overthink the situation because if you do it ends up getting on top of you because you don't know when that next opportunity is going to come."

Despite the disappointment, the 21-year-old recalls one decision which helped to change the course of his career in the professional game.

"I was invited to take part in a showcase game with Onside and from there I was scouted by Martin Carter from Middlesbrough. He invited me up there to go on trial for a couple of weeks which was an exciting couple of weeks.

"I remember thinking I had to go for it, I had worked so long for an opportunity like this and I didn't want this one to pass me by. Middlesbrough spoke to me and showed me the plan they had if I were to be successful.

"That helped me to realise that they would be the right club for me. I saw the pathway and believed it was the right one for me and thankfully I was able to sign a contract with them."

Managed then by the experienced Neil Warnock, Sivi believes the 75-year-old had a huge impact on the winger's ability to settle into his new surroundings.

"I was supposed to be there for a month and Neil Warnock was manager at the time. He came along to one of the games which I

played in and after about two weeks he told me that the club wanted to sign me which was great.

"I ended up spending the next pre-season with the first-team and working with someone like Neil Warnock was a great opportunity for me. That was another big learning curve for me. I was working with the first-team almost every day and I started to learn what it took to be successful at that level.

"It was a great opportunity to play with those players too. I was learning every day but also trying to have my own impact to show what I am capable of.

"The gaffer had loads of faith in me, he gave me a couple of opportunities to play in that pre-season and that gave me confidence so I will always be grateful for him.

"That felt like an extra boost for me to be honest. I was new to the club and the manager had shown a lot of faith in me which definitely helped me."

This confidence was further backed up when Sivi was handed his first-team debut in a Carabao Cup match against Blackpool at the beginning of that season.

"Making my debut in the Carabao Cup was an amazing experience, not just for me but for my family too. I went out there trying to give my all not just for the club but for my family and for the manager who had shown so much faith in me."

However, while still adapting to the demands of professional football, Sivi admits it took him some time to find those heights on a consistent basis.

"I then went on to play U21 / U23 level football that season. That was challenging, I picked up a couple of injuries and found it hard to get going and into a rhythm for that season. I had gone from training and working on my own. It was a big

difference to work in a professional set-up, I was working with the academy side and occasionally being called up to the first-team so it was a big step up intensity.

"That definitely effected my body at that time. Thankfully, I was working with the Physios and Sports Scientists to help me come back stronger. After that, I felt good when I was playing and more importantly I felt like I was improving."

However, after finding form towards the end of that season, Sivi was nominated for the Player of the Month award in March and soon after rewarded with a new contract.

"It was excited to be nominated for the Player of the Month award. I felt like I was playing well and enjoying my football. It definitely boosted my confidence, I felt like my hard work had been noticed so it encouraged me to keep going. To be rewarded with a contract, it showed me that I was doing the right thing. That was a proud moment for my family and I but I didn't want to get complacent on it. I've kept working hard and pushing forward."

As the season drew to an end, the Boro loanee began to look further afield as he looked to test his form through a loan spell in the football league.

"I was feeling sharp and scoring goals, of course the next step was to see if I could do that on a bigger platform. I had experienced men's football before but I felt like a different player at this point.

"I wanted to test myself to see if I could do that. Going on loan, it felt like the next step for me to continue in my development and thankfully the club had a similar plan for me.

"It's difficult for any player who is waiting to go out on loan. At the start of any season, there is always a lot of players available on that basis so no one really knows what is going to happen.



“Every week, I trained as hard as I could and that way if it did happen I was ready to get out there and take my opportunity.”

The 21-year-old would have to wait until deadline day to seal an opportunity to play first-team football with Harrogate Town. Discussing the move, Sivi recalls an uncertainty in the air with hours remaining.

“It got to deadline day and it was a situation where I genuinely didn’t know if I was going to be going out on loan or not. It went right down to the wire but thankfully Harrogate came in and offered me the chance to get out there and play.

“I was excited by this opportunity because I would have my first experience of League Two football. I

am always trying to learn and keep working to better myself every day.

“I have enjoyed my time so far. Everyone here has been so welcoming, it’s a great group of lads and I feel like I have learned a lot being in and around this group.

“There is more games coming thick and fast so it’s all about being ready. I have come off the bench a few times and start a couple of times so it’s just about trying to take those opportunities when they come along.”

After joining on a deal until the end of year, the winger admits his focus is firmly on the here and now as he looks to maximise his development with Town.

“For me, the focus isn’t on how long is left or what is to come. I’m

focused on improving every single day and learning from the players around me. The dressing room is full of players who have a host of experience and I’m trying to tap into that where possible.

“A lot of the players have been passing on advice to me on how to improve. Josh Falkingham has been great for that and giving me that little bit of guidance which I really appreciate.

“The staff here have been brilliant and so welcoming with me. The Gaffer and Thirs are always speaking to me about my game. They are always giving me advice on where to improve which I appreciate because if I can do that then I know I will be given my chance to play.”

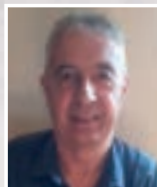

TOWN'S CLUB HISTORIAN PHIL HARRISON LOOKS BACK AT PREVIOUS GAMES BETWEEN THE TWO SIDES



This season brought five firsts for Town – their first campaign as an EFL club, first time playing in the Carabao Cup for the first time, meeting Tranmere Rovers for the first time, playing a first ever Premier league club later in this competition in West Bromwich Albion and being shown on Sky Sports for the first time.

As stated our first ever competitive game against the then recently relegated Tranmere Rovers under new manager Mike Jackson, was the opening match of the season at Prenton Park on Saturday 05 September 2020 – a First Round Carabao Cup tie which ended in a 1-1 draw.

After going a goal behind to a James Vaughan tap in, Lloyd Kerry equalised for Town and was their

first ever scorer in a fixture at this level. However, unfortunately there was no crowd in attendance due to the Pandemic. Town won the penalty shoot-out 8-7 with skipper Josh Falkingham scoring the winning penalty.

The win took Town through to the Second Round and a visit to the Hawthorns to meet Premier League West Bromwich Albion who won 3-0.

The first league meeting between Town and Tranmere was also 2020/21

season with Rovers winning 1-0 on 3 November at the EnviroVent Stadium whilst the reverse fixture brought another defeat for Town 3-2 26 January 2021. Goal scorers for Town were Josh McPake and substitute Josh March (who was on loan for that one season). A James Vaughan brace and Kaiyne Woolery were Tranmere's scorers.

Town finished their first season as an EFL club in 17th place and Tranmere seventh, and reaching the play-off semi-finals, against Morecambe, but failed to return to League One.

Jack Muldoon was Town's top scorer with 15 league and cup goals and James Vaughan was Tranmere's with 22 goals.
