Having been at this club for so long, I know exactly what a Harrogate Town team should be. However, our performance and application in that match fell well short of that

There has been a lot of excitement around this club in recent months. The lads have put in some fantastic performances and registered some important results in doing so.

Naturally, that has left a high bar set for players crossing that white line every week. Of course, we don't expect to win every game but the manner of the last home defeat makes the result hard to take.

In those moments, it is important that we are open and honest with ourselves to ensure we come back stronger. As a group, we sat down and had a conversation about where we short collectively.

The next 11 games are probably the most important part of the season. At this stage, we have given ourselves reason to believe and look upward. However, we can't afford to have many more performances like that because we will be punished.

If we can do that, get on the front foot and create chances then we will hopefully give you something to cheer about come the final whistle.



ello and welcome to today's game, this week we celebrate international women's day, Ahead of International Women's Day, the English Football League (EFL) and EFL clubs will be celebrating female supporters in dedicated activity across England and Wales.

Over 2.9m female supporters attend EFL matches per season with an average of 64,000 female supporters per EFL matchday, whilst the most recent EFL supporters survey revealed:

- 91% of female supporters stated nothing can beat the live football matchday experience.
- 87% of female respondents said they enjoy the atmosphere in the stadium amongst fellow fans.
- 84% said football is an important part of family life.
- 71% suggested going to watch football is a big part of their usual weekly routine.
- 61% said that football is more than about just winning but about feeling a sense of belonging to their town / city's football club.

With an ever-growing female fanbase, throughout the weekend, Clubs will be profiling female supporters and some of the initiatives that are being delivered to attract more women and girls to EFL matches.

When Bristol Rovers fans Lucy Ford and Caz May began speaking to other female football fans, they quickly realised the abuse they had experienced both online and in person, for simply being women who like football, was a much more widespread issue.

It is why the duo, along with 10 other female football supporters, decided to launch the Her Game Too campaign.

The message they are promoting is a simple one: to foster a positive. inclusive environment in football. while raising awareness and educating others about the abuse women who follow football regularly face

Already they have seen their slogan plastered over advertising boarding at grounds on match day, inside programmes, and on the front of Bristol Rovers women's new away kit.

Her Game Too co-founder Lucy Ford is a long-time Bristol Rovers fan.

The Her Game Too survey of almost 400 female fans and returned some shocking stories. Many reported incidents of having their knowledge of football and reasons for watching the sport auestioned, while many others told of being harassed and intimidated.

"That's really what it's about, it's about inspiring the next generation of female football fans, female footballers," Ford said. "And just saying that, you know, you should be allowed to be a female football fan, a female footballer, without being told that you shouldn't because you're a female."

A club ambassador is a voluntary position at #HerGameToo in which a football fan will act as the bridge between #HerGameToo and their club as well as in their local community.

Town's number 27 said: "I wasn't really focused on aoina out on loan. I joined Blackburn six months ago and I was still adapting to my new club. The interest came about really late on in the window, when I heard of the offer I was really keen to come.

"It's a chance for me to play men's football and prove the quality I have. We have high aspirations here, I want to do all I can to contribute to that and prove my worth to Blackburn.

"It's an exciting time, I want to give my all, get some goals and some assists while trying to help the team achieve their wider aims."

After signing for Spurs at the age of six, Bloxham drew several similarities when weighing up his immediate future in January.

"I was playing with Stevenage U8s when I was six and we played up against Spurs, I did really well in that game and after it there was a bit of a race to sign me.

"That was really exciting as there was a few scouts watching that day. I ended up signing for Spurs and thankfully I managed to spend a good part of my career there.

"I was just desperate to enjoy my football, the club made me feel wanted and throughout my time

there I really enjoyed representing the football club.

"Looking back, my time with Spurs really helped me to build up my technical ability. I've always had the challenge of being one of the smallest players on the pitch but having that ability has helped me to overcome that challenge."

However, the 18-year-old believes a strong self confidence and support network helped him to continue on his iourney of progression.

"I have always had confidence in my ability, from a young age I have always backed myself to do well. Obviously, there has been times where I have had to wait for my opportunity but I think that experience has definitely helped me to improve.

"I was living at home and spending time with my family. That is something which was important for me coming through, I had a close circle and a great support network roundabout me.

"When I was younger, I was one of the best players on the pitch most weeks. If I am not, I am asking myself why that is the case. I aspire to be a great player and to prove it every time I cross that white line"

Having been supported by his family

over the course of a 10 year affiliation with Spurs, the winger recalls fond memories of making the step into full-time football.

"I was offered a scholarship pretty early on, I was buzzing to be honest at the time. I didn't really think too much about the greater meaning, I was more focused on the fact I was enioving my football and had the chance to play full-time.

"That was the first big landmark for my career really. That was a proud moment to share with my family because I was another step closer to becoming a professional footballer."

With the opportunity to represent both England or Ireland, Bloxham believes the exposure to international football has challenged him to continue in his development.

""With England, there are so many good players round about you and with Ireland you have a bit more space to potentially be the main man.

"I was offered the opportunity to captain England at U15 level and that was a proud moment. Since then, I have gone on to represent at U16s and U17s level.

"However, as I got older, Ireland had my back. They wanted to play me more and offered me the chance to



play U19s there so I would say I am with them for now.

"Every player wants to play international football, it exposes you to play against the very best which can help you grow so hopefully I have the chance to play more international football as I get older."

Despite spending over 10 years with the London club, Bloxham made the difficult decision to leave Spurs in the summer. With first-team football the aim, the winger discussed his reasons for making the move to Lancashire.

""I was at Spurs for a very long time, when I was leaving it was a little bit emotional. I had spent over 10 years there but I had to do what was best for me.

"There was a lot of club's showing interest in me. However, I was keen to ensure that I joined another club where I felt wanted.

"I feel like I am well appreciated at Blackburn. I joined the club on trial and everyone at the club was great with me so it just felt right.

"I had to earn my opportunity to impress the manager, I scored against Barnsley in pre-season and felt like I was in the managers plans. I got on the bench a few times but had to wait for the game against Harrogate to get on.

"That night I was buzzing to be honest, I was playing with excitement and managed to score so it was a good day. My family were at the game too so it felt good to share that moment with them."

BACK IN TIME SATURDAY 21 AUGUST 2004



TOWN'S CLUB HISTORIAN PHIL HARRISON LOOKS BACK AT A MEMORABLE GAME IN OUR HISTORY



n 2004/05 Town embarked on a new adventure in Nationwide (Conference) North league after leaving the Northern Premier League.

Town's season opened at Wetherby Road with a game against the previous season's third-placed outfit, Barrow and one of the title favourite's which resulted in a 2-1 win for Town in front of 771 with Colin Hunter scoring both goals. Hunter went on to score in each of the next four games.

After drawing with last terms champions Hucknall, Town broke new ground as they travelled south to play Moor Green, a first ever Birmingham based opponent in a league game on Saturday 21 August 2004 which ended in a first defeat after three games but it was also an historic occasion in so much as it was the first time Town had travelled so far south for a league game. It was exciting times ahead especially with five further former Dr Martens league teams from around the Birmingham area to play - Hinckley United, Nuneaton

Borough, Redditch United, Stafford Rangers and Worcester City plus Kettering Town from the Ryman league.

Of the Moor Green game it was a 2-1 defeat with Colin Hunter scoring for Town and Phil Trainer and Darren Middleton for Moor Green in front of a crowd of only 228.

Two arson attacks at the Moorlands in January 2005 when the main stand and clubhouse were gutted left the club homeless and they became tenants of Solihull Borough at Damson Park. In the summer of 2007 the two teams joined forces with Solihull Borough, calling themselves Solihull Moors mainly because of lack of crowds. They played at the latter's ground of Damson Park and are currently in the play-off places in the National League.



"It's been a tough two seasons and things are really turning around. We really have been unlucky to lose in some recent games, but I think the most important thing for us has been keeping that consistency at training and keeping the good energy."

Ella's interest in playing football began at eight years old, when a local community club visited her older sister's school. She began playing with older girls and then with boys her own age, until her dad set up a girls' team for her age group. She played for them throughout her youth career and for a local women's team as she got older. After moving to Leeds for university, she joined the team there.

After graduating, Williams began to look for a new team, but was drawn to Town from the get-go: "I had the intention of trialling with a few clubs to be honest, but Harrogate was the first I went to and it just seemed like a nice place, It's worked out really well and I love the club."

Growing up, Ella credits her dad as inspiration: "He's been pushing for the women's game and advocating in that space. His enthusiasm for the game inspired me a lot.

"I'm a big Portsmouth fan, so I used to love Kanu and all of those players back in the day, so that inspired me as well."

Despite enjoying the sport, the women's captain found her shyness prevented her from making the most of opportunities.

"I wasn't super shy, but the fact that playing football wasn't the most normal thing made me have a lot less confidence with it, maybe I'd be better than I am now, I don't know! I was always quite scared of throwing myself into things like playing at lunchtime and never really did that because I felt like it was a bit unusual or weird. Looking back, I think that's ridiculous, but how do you tell a tenyear-old girl that?"

Luckily, Ella had a great group of friends who also played and continue

One factor contributing to this lack of confidence, Ella says, is finding kit: "You're playing a game where things as simple as shirts and shorts are labelled as 'Youth Boys', when really

there's no difference. I think that's such a deterrent for a lot of girls entering a sport which doesn't feel like it's made for you."

Examples of this include lightcoloured shorts and ill-fitting boots, which contribute to women aettina more ACL injuries: "There's definitely so much more research to come in that space.

"There's still a lot of people who are bitter about the growth of the women's game. I think that's such a shame because football is the best thing, in my opinion, ever! So why shouldn't more people get to enjoy it?

"It's a good thing as long as the infrastructure keeps up with the amount of girls who want to play... We've just got to create that representation in leadership roles - so coaching, officiating - getting women into those roles for young girls and young boys to look up to is so important and probably the slowest area of arowth. That might be slightly limiting and an area to work on."

"Representation is so important." Having important figures represented, especially in media, helps to normalise the presence of all characteristics in the game. If you see it, you can be it and I think that is really important for young people."

"In terms of the women's game, I think it's growing exponentially which is just amazing. Girls in ten years' time are going to have opportunities that I wouldn't have even dreamt of as an eight year old."

Reflecting on last season, Ella highlighted the strategy most important for success: "It was a lot about seeing the season out and sticking together. As a group we really came together... We have got such a good energy within the team, and I think a lot of that starts at training. Making sure it's fun for people, making them want to come back has been important."

The 24-year-old says that "Our young players [between 17 to 21] are some of the most integral players in the squad. It's really important to keep the morale high for them and ensure the longevity of the team... they bring so much value in every way."

On leading the team, Ella has a clear role model: "I absolutely love Sarina Wiegman. I just think she's amazing. Her style, her temperament, the energy she gives off, everything about her is just brilliant and she is so respected because of all those things. I am in no way saying I am trying to embody Sarina Wiegman because that is a difficult feat, but I think there is a lot about her leadership that I really admire and if I was to take something from someone and try to emulate that, then it would definitely be her"

Other than "Be Yourself" and "Keep Playing", Ella can offer some sound advice for those starting out in sport: "Take every opportunity that comes. That's on the pitch and off the pitch. There's such a small network of people in the sport sector and football off the pitch that building your network is so, so important. Doors can open wherever.

"That's one of the best things about football – the people you meet and the connections you make. I would say to any young player, just keep playing and take advantage of all the opportunities because you get so much from it."

Ella admitted that the sona She Wolf has recently become a pre-match anthem for the team. "Certain players of the squad are the instigators of that! She Wolf is the Harrogate Town Women tradition of the season for sure! The team is very aware that we've got a number of games coming up that are really important.

"It's looking up and they're such a wonderful group of girls. It's such a great team feeling and that's what we will aet through the rest of the season with and hopefully get those results locked in that we need

"Something has really switched in the squad... where this team has come together to really fight through to the end of the season. I think the conviction is there from the players to win those games that we know we need to. Everyone is very focused on the same thing. The optimism is there."


































U18S ACADEMY

Town U18s came away from St George's Park with a good point after a well-earned 0-0 draw with high-flying Burton Albion.

Town started brightly and went close to the opener in the ninth minute when Lewis Smallev headed over form Ollie Nicholson's corner.

52nd minute, when Newall forced a strong save from Mooney down to his left hand side and the Town stopper was again on hand to deny the Brewers again in the 58th minute, as he held on to Ronny Wakelin's long range effort.

Emmanuel Ilesanmi then had two huge chances to put his side ahead, first in the 70th minute when he curled into the gloves of Tootell from just inside the area. Then, just a minute later Ilesanmi missed a golden opportunity, turning the ball wide from around four yards out after Josh Brodella had cut the ball back from the byline. In the 74th minute, Burton were forced into a change. with Tommy Miller called upon to replace the injured Tootell, and Miller produced a fine stop in stoppage time to prevent Harrogate snatching all three points. as he turned Brodella's effort aside. before Josh Taroni made a goal-

Signing from Gillingham over the Summer, the centre-back's career began in the youth setup at Luton Town before making the move to Hitchin Town in 2017. The 26-year-old ioined Colchester United in 2018, and after a loan spell at Dagenham & Redbridge joined them permanently before the 2019/20 season. After over 130 appearances and captainining the Daggers he signed for Gillingham in Summer 2022 and made just under 50 appearances for the Gills.



COREY ADDA

Signing for the Reds in July 2022, the 26-year-old goalkeeper began his career at the Arsenal youth academy before linking up with the Coventry U18s in 2014. Whilst with the Sky Blues, Addai enjoyed loan spells with Mickleover and Telford United. Orsi also represented Californian-based side Chivas and Fort Lauderdale in Florida before he returned to the UK.

On his return to England in 2018, he had spells with East Thurrock United, Hungerford Town and Hampton & Richmond Borough before joining Maidenhead United in 2020, Orsi scored 21 goals in 41 appearances in all competitions for Maidenhead. In 2021, after significant interest from EFL clubs, Orsi signed for Harrogate Town and made a total of 14 appearances in all competitions, scoring six goals before joining Boreham Wood on loan in January 2022.

He joined Grimsby Town at the start of the 2022/23 season and went on to make 32 appearances for the Mariners.

This season he is top scorer for the Crawley with an impressive 15 goals to his name so far this campaign.


