FROM THE BOARD

Well what a year!!

Firstly, I'd like to thank **EVERYONE** who has supported the club magnificently this year in what is our most successful season yet within the EFL. We've well and truly put Harrogate on the map as an established league club and I hope we've made our fans and our Town PROUD!

Thanks and appreciation for the commitment shown by the ENTIRE Harrogate Town AFC team on and off the pitch. Everyone has worked tirelessly throughout the season and will work even harder in the break getting ready for the new one!

Aswell as success on the pitch, we've had a great year behind the scenes too. We've finally completed the groundworks to reach the 5000 capacity, incl 2000 seats with the new South stands and facilities, kiosks and bars added last November which enables us to plan well ahead in preparation for the growing number of supporters.

Our Player Development Centres are thriving with the recent addition of our second PDC at Rossett Sports Centre, the home of our Academy team and both our Women's First and Reserves teams. With the introduction of new U5's to U7's sessions, combined with our established St John Fishers school PDC, we've seen rapid growth and now coach around 500 young people aged of 4 to 16 weekly.

We created our new ED&I strategy with everyone in mind and amongst many services, now provide sensory packs, rest seats, stoma toilets and a dedicated Disability Liaison Officer for disabled supporters and carers with an "at your seat" service. Our ongoing commitment to Equality, Diversity, and Inclusion was recognised as part of the EFL Equality Code of Practice with the club accredited with the Bronze standard award.

We've also focused on the EFL Family Excellence scheme and achieved the Silver status, now ranked 34th best club for Family Excellence out of all 72 EFL clubs which is a fantastic improvement on our previous 61st position and Bronze status. This bumps us to 6th best club in League Two for Family Excellence out of all 24 clubs.



We're seeing more young Supporters and first generation fans and have launched our first Junior Supporters Club as well as partnering with 15 local grassroots Junior Clubs across the Harrogate District through our Kick Back scheme

Our First Time Fans Initiative was also launched and has proved a massive success with fans returning following a positive experience. Most commenting on the friendly family atmosphere.

Our Sponsors also deserve a huge thank you! We are grateful to have incredibly committed partners and we recently launched our first "Your Harrogate Town Business Club" in collaboration with Your Harroaate Radio. This was a big success with our First Team Manager Simon Weaver and Olympic sprinter, Roger Black as main speakers and is a networking event specifically for our mutual sponsors to meet in an informal and entertaining way.

We have lots planned for the season ahead as we continue to grow our fantastic club and remain fiercely ambitious as you've come to expect!

We'd like to thank Harrgate & Craven School Boys U13s who have been our ball crew throughout the season.

Comprising players from schools in the Harrogate and Craven area the boys represent their schools in matches in the Yorkshire federation league which spans from Scunthorpe to Salford and Sheffield to York. Throughout the season, the team competes in various tournaments and matches, showcasing their abilities and representing their district with pride.

The boys attended trials back in June 2022, nominated by their PE teachers and from the hundreds of boys in the district 24 were selected. Contemplating the question, Town's boss said: "You get the ecstasy from a promotion, lifting a trophy and lads receiving all the medals, so there are a lot of wow moments from achieving that.

"This season has felt like a really good journey, there have been big bumps in the road but we've managed to just get through everything pretty well.

"We've been rocked a couple of times, but it's not knocked us out. We have grown from each disappointment and we have become better. It's right up there enjoyment wise, we have watched the group work together through issues and come through the other side better.

"It's not guite the high of promotion or winning something but it's certainly right up there for me. We have smashed our record points tally in the Football League and enjoyed so many strong performances."

In a season with so many highs, both George Thomson & Jack Muldoon have led the way in terms of performances and goals in toe.

Of course, the pair are no strangers to success with Harrogate Town. With this in mind, Simon Weaver can not hide his delight in discussing his highlights of the current campaign.

"That's as rewarding as any medal (their success), really. When you talk about a highlight from this season, all I need to do is to take a look at the goals column with both George Thomson and Jack Muldoon excelling for us.

"They're great examples to the younger players in our junior teams to keep working hard. They are two great lads who never cut corners and that work has paid off for them.

"At this point, there would be a lot of people out there who would think it wouldn't pay off for them and lose belief. Speaking on those two, I think they are better players than they ever have been.

"Jack Muldoon is 34 now, yet he has still been one of the shining lights for me. Thommo has been so consistent across the season and has to be in contention to be our Player of the Season."

Fitting perhaps, the pair find themselves on the scoresheet less than 24 hours later in our penultimate home match of the season against Sutton United.

Despite his side being denied victory late on, Weaver believes success of this season can be quantified beyond the league table.

"You can get your iPad out, you can get on the training pitch and you can show on videos. However, the players try to get on the front foot in games, they show a bravery and a courage to try and pass our way through the thirds from the edge of our own box.

"For me, that shows a real buy-in for what we are trying to do. We believe in the lads and have a fondness for their quality as individuals and we have had that paid back.

"We have shown a combination of grit and real style at times. We lost Luke Armstrong at the start of the season really so we had to redesian it.

"We looked at the players we had and identified a way to get the best out of them. However, we had to work hard at that style but the rewards of that are the results it has brought about."

In terms of on the field results and performances, February's draw with Stockport is a poignant moment for Town's longstanding boss. While the score column will tell a 1-1 draw, for Town that Saturday afternoon meant so much more.

"Obviously, the run of 20 points from 10 games was brilliant. We went to Stockport and for the first 15 minutes. we were playing on a totally different level.

"They are a team who have won promotion automatically but we got the ball flowing and could see there is a happiness in the changing rooms. They understood their roles, held belief and scored a really good team goal that day.

"However, a performance like Crewe away, on the back of a big defeat. They were third in the league, battling for automatic promotion places.

"That was where we needed a reaction to the Mansfield defeat but that was immense. As manager, you need people like that with you. That was such a rewarding feeling for the way the lads gritted their teeth.

"You need a big dose of that if you want to do well. We also had a good win against Bradford, it was a difficult day with the conditions but it was a derby day classic."

When assessing these performances, it's important to consider the recruitment of the current campaian. With several of our summer signings performing well, Weaver praised the work of Lloyd Kerry in his Head of Player Recruitment role.

"The recruitment work we have been doing, since January of last year, has gone up a level. It definitely helps being more established as a Football League side.

"Another big part of that, comes from having a quality guy like Lloyd Kerry in there. We trust his judgement in players and believe in his ability to bring options to the table. He also needs the traits and characteristics it takes to play for this football club.

"Everyone recruits differently but we try to look at the person as well as the data. I don't see any data that puts a value on what they're like off the pitch.

"Looking at last season, I was

delighted when we signed Anthony O'Connor. I got on with him straight away and you could see he is very passionate about the game.

"His emergency defence is brilliant, he doesn't spring a surprise. He's so reliable, absolute rock solid and a very talented footballer."

Despite opening day victory, three defeats to Forest Green, Tranmere and Accrington would quickly follow.

Reflecting on this difficult patch, Weaver insisted that belief did not drop as the group pushed to find that winning formula.

"We were searching for a bit to find the right formula, sometimes the disappointment of defeat can consume vou. We had two defeats against Tranmere and Accrington which were bitterly disappointing in the space of a week.

"At that point, it's trying to manage other people in the right way and explaining to them where we needed to improve. We pointed out things that weren't up to scratch if we wanted to be successful.

"The reaction, long term, has been really good. We have values here of working hard and giving our all and I don't think any of the lads can be faulted."

As the season approached a busy run of winter fixtures, Town began to find form with four wins and two draws during the months of November and December

Having pushed through a slower start to the season. Town's boss felt a strong mentality growing within the fresh aroup.

"It was a great time for us all and at that point, you go home each day thinking the lads are flying and they're happy. They understand their roles, we're playing a good brand of football.

"After about 10 games, no one had really sussed us out to the extent where they've suppressed our style so we were still creating more chances in the opposition.

"It was a stylish way of playing and winning as well, all good runs must come to an end but it's a great period to look back on because we were flying high at the time.

"Since then there has been a good sauad mentality which is to not ao under, especially away from home. We play at bigger grounds, hostile environments but they get down to business and work hard.

"We've had good energy out of possession, good communication across the back and we have the pace and ability to break on teams. All of that has combined to play a big part in our success."

As the calendar turned and the January transfer window opened once again, Town quickly sprung into action to secure the signature of loanee and former stopper James Belshaw.

Injuries to Mark Oxlev, Lewis Thomas and Jonathan Mitchell had forced Town into action by securing the 33-year-old on an emergency loan basis from Bristol Rovers.

However, with a string of impressive performances, Town quickly moved to make the transfer a permanent one.

"We were struggling with injuries, Ox started the season really well and then ended up getting injured. Lewis came into the team and picked up an injury himself in training.

"Mitch played really well too, unfortunately he got injured and we were short for options. Lloyd turned to me and mentioned Belly, straight away I was keen to get that done.

"Within 48 hours, he's here. He gave us so much that first game against Notts County, he has the quality which enables us to build from the back.

"He has always been a fantastic keeper but I think he has gone up a couple of notches since he was last with us."

As Town navigated their way through the difficult month of January unbeaten, Weaver picked up the Sky Bet League Two Manager of the Month award.





However, this unbeaten run was abruptly brought to an end at Mansfield on the 13th of February as Town were defeated 9-2.

Now, over two months later, Weaver believes that experience has helped him to improve as a manager.

"I'm not going to sit here and say you just dust yourself down because it was much harder than that. We woke up the next day and felt rotten, we were worried about the players and our professional pride.

"As manager, you sometimes worry about the aftermath of a poor run or a bad result in the undermining of confidence. It can lead to quite a blip at times and the real stopping of positive and proper momentum but while they may be down we don't want them out.

"There is no getting away from the fact that it took a kicking that night, that is where it is important to rationalise the situation.

"For a long time this season we have been very good, for weeks on end actually. For 90 minutes, we weren't. We were punished for that and sometimes that can happen in football. "We were playing on a difficult pitch, against good opposition but looking back there are some things we would change to get a better outcome.

"However, going into the Crewe game, I was determined to give the same group that opportunity straight away to bounce back. They needed the opportunity to get that rotten feeling out of their system.

"We went into that one unchanged and looking at the performance I think it was the biggest statement to the world about the grit we have. We will get back in the ring because we want to win."

With three wins and five draws since the beginning of March, Town and Simon Weaver have set about ensuring they end the campaign strongly.

In looking ahead to next season, Town's boss is asked, 'What does progress look like for you next season?'

"I do feel that off the pitch we are rock solid, Sarah Barry is an outstanding Chief Executive. She manages people really well off the pitch and there is a real togetherness across the club. "You can see the development of the club in our stadium. The new stands really look the part and we are maximising our income to help make the club more sustainable and more stable for the future.

"We want to help the local community, we are looking at what we can do to achieve that aim and hopefully bring in new supporters.

"On the pitch, I would love to be a consistent and confident looking top ten team at this level, hopefully that means taking the odd shock result out of it.


"That drive to improve is there across the football club as a whole, we want to improve our offering to women's football to get more girls in the local area playing football.

"We are looking at what we can do to engage with Harrogate locally, we are lining up a few things for pre-season to bring the fans in and familiarise them with the players as people.

"If we are to excel as a club it has to be a holistic view of things. We have come so far over the last couple of years so if we can keep that journey going then we will be in a really good place.

For the final History page this season we go back some 65 years to Saturday 27 September 1958 as Town and Harrogate Railway met for the first time in the Preliminary Round of the FA Amateur Cup.

The FA Amateur Cup was basically a non-league version of the FA Cup and was replaced with the new FA Trophy in 1970, which Town won in 2020.

In 1958/59, Town were playing in Yorkshire League Division Two and Railway a league higher in Division One.

Railway won the tie 4-1 at Wetherby Road thanks to goals from future Town player Arthur Everitt (2), Peter Reynard and Kenny Fountain with future Rail player Dave Nolan scoring a consolation for the hosts. There were seven former Town players playing for the Rail that day and despite the visitor's being second bottom of their league, class told. Town were without Ross, Hutton and Wallace as they didn't qualify having been professionals and brothers John (who had recently joined Rail from Town) and Geoff Walker had

made their first appearances of the season in this game.

Town XI: A. Taylor, Buck, Clark, Newton, Lund, R. Taylor, Todd, Davey, Wall, Nolan, Cooper. Rail fielded: Glaister, Hawkes, Tyson, W. Smith, Hill, J. Walker, Reynard, G. Walker, A. Everitt, Kempster and Fountain.

Railway under 'Chick' Farr, were relegated to Division Two at the end of the season whilst Town under Jack 'Boss' Townrow had finished mid-table. Top Town scorer was Laurie Hutton with 17 goals with Rail's Kenny Fountain scoring 20.1 do know that Arthur Everitt, Eddie Buck and Geoff Walker are still alive and will be expecting this programme from me shortly!







WARREN O'HORA

Warren O'Hora is into his third season with MK Dons, having joined the Club, initially on loan, in August 2020. The Irishman began his career with hometown club Bohemians before joining Brighton & Hove Albion in May 2018. He made his loan move to Stadium MK permanent midway through the 2020/21 season and has made over 100 club appearances. This season he has been almost ever-present in the back line for the Dons

JACK PAYNE

Joining on a season-long loan from Charlton Athletic, Payne made his pro debut for Southend United back in August 2013. Since then the midfielder has over 400 career appearances for eight different clubs spending the majority of his career at League One level, during spells with Southend, Swindon Town, Charlton, Bradford City, Oxford United, Lincoln City and Blackburn Rovers. He also played in the Championship with Huddersfield Town.

ALEX GILBEY

The previous two-time MK Dons Player of the Year award winner returned to Stadium MK last Summer following his departure from Charlton Athletic.

A product of Colchester United's academy, he went on to make 121 appearances for the U's after making his senior debut for the club at the age of 17 in October, 2012 before joining Wigan Athletic in 2016. Gilbey then moved to MK Dons in 2017, playing 105 games and scoring 11 goals in his three years at Stadium MK before signing for Charlton in August, 2020. The midfielder recently achieved his second promotion from the Sky Bet League Two division whilst on loan with Stevenage, his first promotion was achieved with the Dons during the 2018/19 season.

The 29-year-old has 11 goals and 10 assists to his name this season.



DANIEL HARVIE

Harvie, 25, moved to Stadium MK from Ayr United in July 2020 and has since made over 100 appearances. Born in Glasgow, Harvie began his career with Aberdeen and made his senior debut in March 2016. The left back, who joined Ayr United in July 2018, made 116 senior club appearances during his time north of the border, while he also totalled over 20 international caps for Scotland at every youth level from Under-15s through to Under-21s

MAX DEAN

Joining MK Dons in January 2023 from Leeds United, Dean, 20, is a highly-rated young striker who come through the Academy ranks at Elland Road and was a prolific scorer for Leeds' youth teams. Stepping up to the Under-21s in 2020, Dean hit 16 goals in just 27 starts for the Whites' development side while he also found the net three times in six EFL Trophy appearances. This season he is the Dons top scorer with 14 goals to his name
